TIB Youth Outreach Summary: Foster High School

As part of the Department of Community Development's TIB Outreach, 5 seperate focus groups were held with local Foster High School Students. Planners from the City of Tukwila met with tstudents in their classrooms and explained the changes being considered for the neighborhood as a result of the Tukwila International Boulevard District Element of the Comprehensive Plan.

During these small focus group discussions students were asked for feedback to three questions:

- 1. What do you love about the TIB neighborhood? What are the hidden gems?
- 2. What areas of TIB make you most uncomfortable? Why? Do you have ideas about how to solve the problem?
- 3. What are your favorite streets and neighborhoods in the Seattle region?

Several general themes and priorities emerged from this collection of data. The following pages highlight the input that was received and present the youth perspective.

Word clouds visually illustrate all the tresponses to the questions and also highlight the weight of the answers. The clouds give greater prominence to words that appeared more frequently in responses.

Full notes were taken for these focus groups and and the responses can be seen in a supporting document located in Appendix A.

What do you *love* about the TIB neighborhood?



There were many responses to this question, including favorite restaurants and public amenities such as Foster High School, Foster Library, and Tukwila Pool. But the overwhelming response for most loved places in the TIB neighborhood are the food trucks!

What areas of TIB make you most uncomfortable?



Do you have ideas about how to solve the problem?

There were varied responses to this question but most comments fell under the umbrella of increasing walkability, providing more amenities and enhancing public safety. There were several reoccurring suggestions that stood out that are listed below. Referencing the full notes on this question is suggested as there are a number of safety concerns raised by participants that warrant review.

- 1. The TIB Neighborhood needs more sidewalks & safer crossings.
- 2. More cleanup and better lighting is needed on TIB and in Cascade View Park.
- 3. A teen hangout center is desired.
- 4. More stores and services such as restaurants, groceries, and coffee shops are wanted.
- 5. Get rid of businesses, such as Deja Vu and others, that support illegal activity.
