Dear Tukwila Job Seeker,

We know that some unemployment benefits are ending soon and many people are looking for a new job. If you are one of those people, here are some resources that may help.

WorkSource

For most job seekers, we recommend WorkSource. WorkSource is a partnership of government agencies and nonprofit organizations that provides an array of <u>free</u> employment and training services to job seekers and employers in Washington State. You can access services online through <u>www.WorkSourceWA.com</u> or through their network of more than 60 WorkSource centers, affiliates, and connection sites. Due to the pandemic, most offices are currently closed for in-person assistance but many services are available online. WorkSource provides the following services:

- Job search assistance (find job listings with links to online applications at https://seeker.worksourcewa.com/jobsearch/advancedsearch.aspx)
- Job fairs
- Career advice
- Resume and cover letter assistance
- Interview preparation classes
- Office equipment when applying for jobs
- Training and other services for people who have lost their jobs

The job listings on WorkSource are provided by Monster.com, which says it is the "world's largest commercial job board". It currently lists over 50,000 jobs posted within the past 30 days that are within ten miles of Tukwila.

WorkSource also links to other job boards, which may have easier search tools. Find those at: https://seeker.worksourcewa.com/Resources/JobBoards.aspx. One of those other job boards is www.Indeed.com which currently lists 1,545 jobs in Tukwila, of which 460 were posted within the past 14 days and reflect a variety of job types, primarily in logistics, retail, and customer service.

Trac Associates is a for-profit employment and training company that provides **free**, comprehensive vocational assistance services for disadvantaged job seekers including those who are disabled, veterans, homeless, public benefit recipients, Limited English Proficient (LEP), low-basis skills, illiterate, mature (55+), minority (including race, ethnicity, and religion), and long-term unemployed. Trac Associates provides assistance in multiple languages including Amharic, Arabic, Bosnian, Burmese, Cambodian, Chinese, Farsi, Moldovan, Oromo, Romanian, Russian, Serbo-Croatian, Somali, Spanish, Swahili, Tigrinya, Ukrainian, and Vietnamese.
