## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The City of Tukwila manages its stormwater drainage system (MS4) in compliance with the Western Washington Phase II Municipal Stormwater Permit issued by the Washington State Department of Ecology. “Stormwater” is a regulated pollutant under both the Federal Clean Water Act (Title 33 United States Code, Section 1251 *et seq.*) and the State Water Pollution Control Act (RCW 90.48). Stormwater is classified as a wastewater and is defined in the permit as “runoff during and following precipitation and snowmelt events, including surface runoff, drainage or interflow”. Rain becomes polluted when it meets human development like roads, parking lots and buildings, construction, industrial and/or commercial activities and can become polluted by events like illegal dumping, illicit connections or improper maintenance of drainage systems. The resulting wastewater is termed by Federal Code as “Stormwater”. Most outside drains carry rain to local surface waters, like wetlands, creeks and rivers, and ultimately flow into Puget Sound. The City of Tukwila’s permit requires us to reduce the discharge of stormwater to the “Maximum Extent Practicable” and eliminate non-stormwater entirely.

This Surface Water Management Program (SWMP) is targeted at reducing pollution generated from all lands owned and operated by the City of Tukwila, including rights-of-way, parks, and all facilities. Managing stormwater and meeting permit requirements is reliant on undertaking operational and structural best management practices. This is termed **AKART** or **All Known, Available and Reasonable methods of prevention, control and Treatment**. In Tukwila, we practice Adaptive Management which means when we find a better way of working that reduces pollution and meets many other factors to consider, like cost, and/or timeline, we include those

new efforts to reduce the effects of stormwater on surface waters to the maximum extent practicable (MEP).

The City provides an Annual Report for the previous year's activities that documents required permit actions and our adaptive management efforts to meet more than 90 conditions. Both current and past annual reports and SWMPs are on the City's website at:

### STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM COMPONENTS

The Permit was reissued in 2024 and now includes new permit requirements that allow time to develop and implement them. New requirements and required timelines are summarized in Appendix A. NPDES Permits run in 5-year terms *concurrently*, meaning that program requirements from past permits still apply even when not fully described in the most recent permit.

The 2024 – 2029 Phase II Permit contains the following surface water management program components:

- S5.C1 Stormwater Planning
- S5.C2 Public Education and Outreach
- S5.C3 Public Involvement and Participation
- S5.C4 MS4 Mapping and Documentation
- S5.C5 Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination
- S5.C6 Controlling Runoff from New and Redevelopment, and Construction Sites
- S5.C7 Stormwater Management for Existing Development
- **S5.C8 Source Control Program for Existing Development (new chapter)**
- S5.C9 Operations and Maintenance

*In addition to the SWMP components, the Permit contains special conditions covering:*

- Total Maximum Daily Load Requirements (none currently applicable to Tukwila)
- Monitoring and Assessment
- Reporting and Signatory Authority Requirements

## 2.0 PERMIT COORDINATION EFFORTS

Tukwila must implement a Stormwater Planning program to inform and assist in the development of policies and strategies such as water quality management tools to protect receiving waters. This requires the full complement of city staff. For instance, Information Technology staff are needed to administer the many computer systems of tracking and record keeping, to provide labor-saving devices and paperless processes that allow for immediate record retrieval and permanent retention.

Tukwila internally issued Administrative Order 900-08 included in Appendix B to form an interdepartmental team to address all requirements and remove barriers to compliance.

### 2.1 Coordination Among Permittees

To help clarify roles and responsibilities for the control of pollutants between physically interconnected and permitted MS4s, Tukwila implements watershed coordination efforts with adjacent entities as necessary. Also, to avoid conflict related to plans, policies and regulations, the City coordinates management activities for shared water bodies and/or watersheds. As a matter of course, the City interacts with the following regional groups and stormwater management forums:

- Regional Permit Coordinators (Phase I and Phase II jurisdictions)
- Stormwater Outreach for Regional Municipalities (STORM)

- Regional Operations and Maintenance Program (ROADMAP)
- Business Inspection Group (BIG)
- Lower Duwamish Source Control Working Group and Duwamish Inspectors Group (DIG)
- WRIA 9 (Water Resource Inventory Area) Stakeholder Watershed Planning (17 different participating jurisdictions)
- The Stormwater Action Monitoring Work Group (SAM)
- Our Green Duwamish, King County led consortium in WRIA 9

## **2.2 Coordination Among City Departments**

Internally, the implementation of Tukwila’s SWMP Plan is coordinated through City Administration Policy (900-08) that defines departmental responsibilities and actions. Coordination elements include program development, reporting, notification, documentation, recordkeeping, data tracking and employee training. A coordinator works with all representatives to ensure timely actions are taken. In the event timely actions are not taken, the City files General Condition 20 (G20) notifications to the Department of Ecology that explain the steps taken or planned to reduce, eliminate, or prevent reoccurrence of the non-compliance.

## **3.0 STORMWATER PLANNING**

In 2026, Tukwila will continue City-wide stormwater management planning with a collaborative multi-departmental framework, utilizing the skills of many individuals whose work either focuses on or touches stormwater planning. These professionals are brought together to determine how to improve the quality of water that might be entering the MS4 and then leaving or discharging through the MS4 outfall to surface waters. Stormwater Planning includes the following five elements:

### **3.1 Interdisciplinary Team**

The bulk of stormwater planning work is done by Interdisciplinary Team members from the City’s Department of Public Works, the Department of Community Development and the Technology and Information Services Department. The team’s make-up and participation is reviewed upon staff turnover, to accommodate workload/duties adjustments, as well as interest and expertise in the subject. The team informs and assists in the development of the permit required Stormwater Management Program and works on stormwater planning and stormwater-related policy development. The team meets to discuss stormwater topics as they relate to efforts like SMAP and the development of the City’s update to the Surface Water Comprehensive Plan.

### **3.2 Long-range Plan Updates**

Tukwila reviews water quality and watershed protection policies, strategies, codes and other measures to identify stormwater management needs. This work also informs whether locally initiated or state-mandated long-range land use plan updates are called for (those designed to accommodate growth or transportation for protecting/improving receiving water health). Per Permit section S5.C.1.6.i (b), the City developed a report describing long-range planning coordination that has taken place during the current Permit term. Multiple capital infrastructure projects (CIP) that were planned through this effort including the funding and schedule for completion are being adjusted to meet reduced funding capacity and workload considerations. The new CIP will be published and put into public comment period as with many other comprehensive planning processes in Tukwila. Public notices will be sent using utility bill inserts, city publications, city websites and social media avenues.

### 3.3 Low Impact Development

The City's Permit Center engineering plan review staff continue to review development permit applications against the city's Low Impact Development (LID) code and the adopted King County Stormwater Management Manual (most current) ensuring the use of stormwater management principles and LID BMPs as the preferred option for development and re-development. Accordingly, LID BMPs and LID principles are encouraged as a preferred and commonly used approach to site development and required infeasibility tests ensure LID has been fully considered. Annual assessments help identify administrative or regulatory barriers. Changes may be implemented when local development-related codes, rules, standards, or other enforceable documents support their need.

New requirements from the 2023 HB 1110 which was codified in RCW 36.70A (Growth Management Act) in the State Legislature more commonly referred to as "Middle Housing" seeks to increase housing density in areas traditionally zoned for low-density or "single-family" residential use. This legislation has already spurred the construction of accessory dwelling units, "mother-in-law" apartments, and similar developments within areas previously dedicated to Low Impact Development (LID) strategies. While the addition of new impervious surfaces to areas previously credited for infiltration may appear to conflict with our surface water goals, the City's path forward is collaborative. The Public Works and Community Development departments will work proactively with developers and property owners to identify and implement innovative site designs that successfully balance the higher density mandated by HB 1110 with our strict LID stormwater requirements. Furthermore, because increased human occupation naturally introduces more household pollutants (e.g., cleaners, automotive chemicals), we will expand our targeted education and outreach efforts for these newly densified neighborhoods to mitigate runoff impacts.

### 3.4 Stormwater Management Action Plan (SMAP)

Tukwila has begun to implement components of the Stormwater Management Action Plan (SMAP 2023) developed in the last permit term for the Riverton Creek basin. The multi-step SMAP effort conducted with the help of consultants included development of a watershed inventory, identification of existing water quality conditions for each receiving water catchment area in the city, assessment and prioritization of identified receiving waters and the identification of several projects in the selected basin (Riverton) that will address water quality. SMAP assessment and prioritization functions to:

- Conserve, protect and/or restore receiving waters through stormwater and land management strategies that act as water quality management tools.
- Reduce pollutant loading.
- Address hydrologic impacts from existing development and help plan for expected future buildout conditions.

The new permit term contains new SMAP requirements that will build on the previous city-wide assessment. The city will be selecting a new priority basin and actions or improvements that will positively impact the water quality from that basin. Preliminary reviews of this process show that Southgate Creek is the next priority basin given the conditions found in the 2023 SMAP effort. Projects related to stormwater are being identified from the Small Drainage Program, an effort to accomplish repairs and improvements to maintainability and serviceability within the MS4. Added IDDE inspections, Business Source Control contacts, Private Drainage Inspections and other actions are being conducted already and could be increased and coordinated with efforts from WSDOT maintenance that has a large corridor through most of Tukwila.

### 3.5 Stormwater Management for Existing Development (SMED)

Tukwila is implementing a Stormwater Management for Existing Development (SMED) Program to control or reduce stormwater discharges to waters of the state from areas of existing development. This program is called the “Stormwater outfall water quality retrofit project”. This program has added and will add water quality treatment of appropriate types to roadways, parks, city facilities and open space. This project is described in Appendix H. Currently the city has fully met its SMED obligations of retrofitting 3.6 acres of developed area under MS4 control. Tukwila has many other projects that will be forwarded in the coming permit term of 2029-34 with 50% credit. This has been largely due to Tukwila’s investment in infrastructure using available grants and funding sources from various partners.

Permittees shall report which projects may provide Tribal benefits and benefits to overburdened communities including specifically Vulnerable Populations and Highly Impacted Communities.

- Tukwila projects will directly benefit native tribes within the Upper Duwamish which sits wholly within the jurisdictional boundaries of Tukwila. They are The Suquamish Tribe, and the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe. These rights were established by the 1855 Treaty of Point Elliott and reaffirmed by the 1974 "Boldt Decision" (*U.S. v. Washington*), which designates these tribes as co-managers of the fisheries alongside the State of Washington. The Duwamish Tribe, while historically linked to the river, is not currently federally recognized. Because they lack federal recognition, they do not have the same court-enforced treaty fishing rights as the Muckleshoot or Suquamish tribes but will still benefit from Tukwila projects that improve the habitat and water quality of the river.

The city will forecast the amount of equivalent acres managed by stormwater facility retrofits or equivalent program elements for the next permit term (2029-2032) and report this along with the regular annual report due March 31, 2028.

## 4.0 PUBLIC EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

The City’s Public Education and Outreach program serves a diverse Tukwila community. Our Public Education efforts are strategically driven to deliver effective personal messaging to residents, property owners, fixed and mobile businesses, and commercial and industrial property managers. We work to build general awareness, effect behavior change, and create stewardship opportunities for residents and other interested parties.

### 4.1 Regional Program Elements

The City partners with neighboring jurisdictions in Watershed Coordinated efforts and utilizes various regional resources and public partnerships, including but not limited to:

#### **Stormwater Outreach for Regional Municipalities (STORM)**

- Incorporation of practical municipal stormwater information obtained from regular STORM meetings, symposiums, networking, programs, and resources.
- Co-branding Puget Sound Starts Here (PSSH) on printed materials; and linking PSSH events, materials, and tools from the City’s NPDES web page.

#### **Washington Stormwater Center (WSC)**

- Utilization of WSC municipal stormwater management and training resources to improve public education and outreach communications, framing of messages, designing of ideas for targeted audiences, engagement of overburdened communities, and creation of appropriate outreach materials.

#### **Municipal Resource Service Center/ Washington Cities Insurance Agency**

- Utilizing the expertise and knowledge of these resources to educate citizens in many areas of utilities including property maintenance that affects surface water.

**Regional Meetings and Watershed Coordination**

- Participating in regional groups (see Section 2.1) to collaborate on Permit-related public education opportunities.

**4.2 Building General Awareness**

The City of Tukwila implements a multi-media Stormwater General Awareness effort that utilizes the many media avenues available to us. We use the City of Tukwila Facebook Page and the City of Tukwila Hazelnut Publication, as well as Utility billing inserts, and “tabling” at outreach events in the city and county. We “table” at events like the Mayor’s Annual Address, Touch A Truck at Southcenter Mall, and have a presence outside council chambers and within the Permit center. We partner with Tukwila schools who report there are over 80 languages spoken within their district. To educate students on the issue that stormwater presents to the community and our broader society we will be partnering with Adopt A Drain K-12 education to provide stormwater education to 10 classrooms per school year. This will focus students on the problem of stormwater so that they can adjust their individual actions and reduce their effect on surface waters during ordinary living within their community. Tukwila plans to engage with its language translation partners to address the many language barriers in Tukwila. We have translated our main message poster set into Spanish and will be translating into several other languages in the coming permit term. Much of the problem with this kind of outreach is the difference between translating the words of Western Washington policies into concepts that can be understood in other languages, since the concept of “stormwater” as a pollutant is wholly within the United States and does not directly translate in languages other than English.

There are also many general awareness efforts that were begun under past permit cycles that remain in place to educate specific sections of Tukwila society and the surrounding watershed partners. Our private drainage inspector and business source control inspector provide direct one on one or one to many communications that build general awareness within the multi-family residential, commercial and industrial workers that work in the city daily. Along with technical assistance during business source control inspections and illicit discharge events, **Table 1** (below) identifies the various permit-required General Awareness program elements, target audiences, and outreach approaches used by Tukwila currently.

The City collaborates with StormFest, an annual program that aims to reduce and/or eliminate behaviors and practices that cause or contribute to adverse stormwater impacts by educating school-aged children. In 2025, Tukwila staff provided educators to StormFest, a three-day interactive stormwater festival held at Des Moines Beach Park. In 2026, Tukwila Staff will again support StormFest members including Highline School District, the Environmental Science Center, and Enviro-Issues. Tukwila has sent educators and staff for the past several years to this outdoor in-stream education and plans to continue this in the foreseeable future.

### 4.3 Affecting Behavior Change

In 2025, Tukwila Staff assisted in teaching the Stormfest Curriculum at the festival. In addition, the City joined the Adopt A Drain program attended by many other local municipalities. Residents are encouraged to keep drains clean and clear of blocking matter which causes local flooding and the discharge of solid waste to surface waters. This complements the City program of Adopt A Spot where citizens are encouraged to keep areas of parks and trails free from litter, waste and debris and report their activities, see Appendix L.

### 4.4 Stewardship Opportunities

The City uses a variety of activities and events to raise stormwater quality awareness and to encourage community engagement and adoption of environmentally friendly behaviors. Table 2 describes stewardship outreach efforts that are offered or promoted by the City throughout 2025. Many of these opportunities involve multiple regional partners who collaborate with the City to assist in the regional effort to mitigate the effects of land-form changing development that has occurred over 150 years of residential, commercial and industrial development which has built the greater Puget Sound into the regional, national and global economic engine of today.

## 5.0 PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT AND PARTICIPATION

Public Involvement and Participation is encouraged in the development of this annual plan. Citizens are informed through education and outreach efforts about this plan and all its elements as well as their ability to influence its many efforts to comply with the permit. In addition, the public is invited within the Surface Water and Transportation Comprehensive Planning process, SMAP framework, and other Stewardship opportunities the City provides to participate and involve themselves in developing this plan. Ongoing public involvement, participation, and decision-making opportunities are advertised at outreach fairs, stewardship events, education seminars and council meetings. Furthermore, Tukwila continues to identify and implement more effective ways to engage the overburdened community. These efforts include translation of printed materials into some of the eighty-nine (89) languages spoken in Tukwila Schools and the broader community households.

Throughout the year, the public is encouraged to comment on Comprehensive Planning, the SWMP Plan, SMAP and SMED efforts. Public involvement and participation outreach efforts involve mailings and postings of important and timely messages and meeting invitations on the Public Works Stormwater Management web page, and through specialized media, including the Hazelnut and the Tukwila Web Page and Facebook Page and in periodic utility billing inserts.

The following includes specific public involvement and participation opportunities highlighted for 2026:

- Posting of the 2026 SWMP Plan by May 31 to the City website and the 2025 annual report State Secure Access Washington Account by March 31.
- Public opportunities as available during 2026-2027 as the new Surface Water Comprehensive Plan is implemented with Council Approval.
- Posting routine state and local public notices when required for certain construction and planning efforts.
- Public information and Involvement open houses at The State of City address, neighborhood coordination meetings and the permit center.
- Announcements in the City publication Hazelnut and Facebook account along with Utility billing inserts inviting comments on the SWMP and volunteer opportunities.

## **6.0 MS4 MAPPING AND DOCUMENTATION**

The City implements a comprehensive program to map and document the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4). Ongoing mapping involves procedures to identify, analyze and process Geographic Information Systems (GIS) data. Maintained feature mapping data includes stormwater conveyance infrastructure, outfalls, discharge points, receiving waters, treatment and flow control facilities, tributary conveyances, drainage areas, land use, connections, and other components.

TIS, GIS, Public Works Operations, and Asset Management work together to generate MS4 feature data. These efforts help the City meet Permit-required stormwater management program goals. Municipal work that benefits from mapping information includes future planning, economic development, engineering review, public education, spill response, private water quality facility and source control inspections, construction, operations, and maintenance. Through an external web-based application portal, Tukwila also provides map-based information resources for residents, visitors, engineers, planners, designers, and emergency responders.

In 2026, the City of Tukwila plans to support existing MS4 mapping by continuing to:

- Improve stormwater data as needed within the Geographic Information System (GIS) to enhance user experience, ensure current and future regulatory requirements, and to serve as a system of record.
- Further Implement a Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS) called Lucity designed to provide and track work orders and service requests. The CMMS may also help manage stormwater assets and perform risk/cost analyses.
- Operations acquired a new CCTV video inspection truck in 2024 and is beginning an updated program of inspection and documentation of MS4 asset conditions.
- Engineering acquired (5) Global Positioning System (GPS) devices and joined the Washington State Reference Network to provide accurate mapping of all utilities and surface waters in Tukwila.

- Integrate various asset management program software to assist in stormwater resource allocation, prioritization, funding strategies and maintenance schedules.
- Restore the building official process of requiring as-built record drawings and using the survey data from the New and Redevelopment projects and CIP project surveying to inform the GIS and CMMS systems with the most current asset management data.

To fully meet Permit requirements, the City will respond to all mapping requests in compliance with national security laws and directives. Tukwila makes this GIS geospatial data easily available to the public via the internet on the Tukwila Maps and GIS webpage, with viewable and downloadable MS4 mapping formats.

## **7.0 ILLICIT DISCHARGE DETECTION AND ELIMINATION**

The City carries out a comprehensive Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE) program for preventing, detecting, characterizing, tracing, and eliminating stormwater pollution. Permit required minimum performance measures involve:

- Means, Modes and Methods for initiating investigations.
- Procedures for recordkeeping, reporting and correcting or removing illicit connections, spills, and other illicit discharges.
- Processes for informing public employees, businesses, and the public of hazards associated with illicit discharges and improper disposal of waste.
- Public education and code enforcement mechanisms that effectively prohibit non-stormwater discharges into the MS4 to the maximum extent.
- Training programs for all municipal field staff who are responsible for identification, investigation, termination, cleanup, and reporting of illicit discharges (including spills and illicit connections) see Appendix E.

### **7.1 IDDE Procedures**

Tukwila uses the Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination Field Procedures and Response Plan (IDDE Plan) provided in the MANUAL which provides a framework for:

- Characterizing any found or reported illicit discharges.
- Tracing illicit discharge sources (visual inspections monitoring of pollutants, see appendix K annual inspection report).
- Eliminating discharges: notification of appropriate authorities, notification of property owner, technical assistance, follow-up inspections and use of compliance strategies (escalating enforcement and legal actions).
- Developing and implementing employee training and recordkeeping programs (see Appendix E Training Plan).

#### **7.1.1 Field Screening**

Field screening is used for the inspection and evaluation of the City's MS4 to identify and eliminate potential sources of stormwater pollution; our procedures consider local stormwater system characteristics to help identify water quality concerns. Field screening is performed in tandem with ongoing program assessment, inspection, and cleaning of the MS4 (see Section 9.0). In accordance with Permit requirements, the City field screens a minimum of 12% of the MS4 on average each year.

#### **7.1.2 Incident Response**

Tukwila implements procedures for spill response and improper disposal into MS4. In doing so, designated city personnel respond to incidents and implement procedures to control and

eliminate sources of stormwater pollution (with priority given to incidents that impact public safety, public health, and the environment). IDDE Incident Response Procedures provide for:

- Definition of roles and responsibilities (both internal and external).
- Spill response, emergency response, and outside agency coordination as needed.
- Standardized reporting procedures, investigations, documentation, and follow-up procedures.

## **7.2 IDDE Communications**

Established communication processes result in well-coordinated IDDE incident responses. Public Works Environmental Compliance staff that are assigned to track IDDE complaints obtain all necessary and relevant information for the purpose of evaluating potential public health, public safety, or environmental threats.

If the report is credible, a formal IDDE compliance investigation is launched to address the nature of the discharge, determine the source of the discharge, identify the responsible party, and eliminate the contamination by removing all discharged materials. The elements of an effective investigation include immediate characterization of the illicit discharge threat, initiation of notifications, site investigation, documentation of conditions and completion of recordkeeping.

### **7.2.1 Incoming IDDE Reports**

Illicit discharge reports are received by the City in various ways including, but not limited to:

- Direct calls to the Spill Hotline (206-433-1860), e-mail, SeeClickFix© web/mobile application complaints, after-hours dispatch calls, and in-person communication.
- Information received from internal city operations (staff communication, personal observation, inspection program referrals and MS4 field screening operations).
- Referrals from Ecology's Environmental Report Tracking System.
- External agency and franchise services direct referrals.
- Staff witnessing polluting activities, see 7.4 below.

### **7.2.2 External IDDE Notifications**

Once information concerning a suspected or known illicit stormwater discharge is reported to or received by City staff, proper notification sequences are triggered that are based upon the severity of the incident. If necessary, appropriate external entities are notified, which may include:

- Local Fire District (Puget Sound Regional Fire Authority)
- Department of Ecology (Required ERTS reporting)
- Local Sanitary Sewer Authority (Valley View Sewer)
- Public Water Utility (Water District 125 and Highline Water District)
- Tukwila Police
- King County Public Health (Environmental Services for Septic)
- Adjacent jurisdictions or agencies within the same watershed

Beginning in 2027, Ecology requires Tukwila to manage post-emergency clean-up and disposal activities from Fire Fighting activities. Currently, Puget Sound Regional Fire Authority notifies the city when a fire is in progress and may affect city water, sewer and stormwater resources. Tukwila Public Works operations and maintenance are often on scene before the emergency response is complete and is in contact with property owners about needed actions. Formal tracking of this is expected by Ecology and will be included in Lucity work orders as usual.

### 7.3 Regulatory Mechanisms

Ordinances, Tukwila Municipal Code (TMC) and other enforceable documents enable the City to implement the IDDE program through three regulatory mechanisms:

- TMC 14.30.180: Surface and Stormwater-Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination
- TMC 14.28: Surface and Stormwater Management
- TMC 8.45: Code Enforcement

### 7.4 Employee Training

All field-employees receive in-house IDDE training as needed detailed in Appendix E. All staff receive awareness level training during their on-boarding with Human Resources. Responsible staff whose normal duties include identification, investigation, termination, cleanup, and reporting of illicit discharges are trained in the necessary best management practices. Follow-up training is provided as needed to address changes in procedures, techniques, requirements, or staffing, which may include annual refreshers, review of case-studies and informal training in the form of safety and other staff meetings. Staff who may have opportunity to witness and report IDDE are trained to recognize and report IDDE internally to begin the proper response.

### 7.5 IDDE Recordkeeping

IDDE compliance investigations involve rapid assessment of threats to public health, public safety, or the environment. Effective Tukwila IDDE investigations begin with procedures that involve the collection and recording of relevant and accurate incident information and documentation such as photos and field indicator tests. Accordingly, IDDE incident recordkeeping utilizes the City SAW Account to document each effort for annual reporting.

Requests that contain the following standard information: date of incident, location, reporting source, pollutant, cause, corrective actions, photos, various forms of written communication and progress summary notes. In 2024, IT is developing an improved web-based portal workflow within Lucity that will produce a more comprehensive IDDE investigatory format for reporting and compliance. Pursuant to Special Condition S9.A, the City provides a yearly summary of IDDE incidents with the permit required Annual Report (Section 12.1).

## 8.0 CONTROLLING NEW AND REDEVELOPMENT, AND CONSTRUCTION SITES

Tukwila's Development and Construction Runoff Control program promotes public health, safety, and welfare by establishing a comprehensive approach to surface and storm water problems. This program reduces flooding, erosion and sedimentation, prevents/mitigates habitat loss, enhances groundwater recharge, and prevents water quality degradation. Drainage review is required for any proposed project (except those proposing only maintenance) that is subject to a City of Tukwila development permit or approval. Specific program elements include permitting, basin and sub-basin planning, land use regulation, facility construction approval, and post construction inspections, see appendix k, annual inspection report..

The City of Tukwila implements and enforces this Permit-required program to reduce pollutants in stormwater runoff from new development, redevelopment, and construction sites. The minimum performance measures of this Permit-required program are:

- Utilizing ordinances or other enforceable mechanisms to address runoff from new development, redevelopment, and construction site projects.
- Using requirements, limitations and criteria approved by Ecology.
- Implementing a permitting process with site plan review, inspection, and enforcement capability to meet the standards.

- Making available, as applicable, the link to the electronic Construction Stormwater General Permit Notice of Intent (NOI) form for construction activity and, as applicable, a link to the electronic Industrial Stormwater General Permit NOI form for industrial activity to representatives of proposed new development and redevelopment.
- Enforcing local ordinances to control runoff from sites covered by stormwater permits issued by Ecology.
- Ensuring proper training for all development and construction staff involved with this program.

## 8.1 Regulatory Standards and Enforceable Mechanisms

In compliance with current Permit requirements, a combination of codes and adopted standards enables the City to control runoff from new development, redevelopment, and construction sites. In 2022, Tukwila updated the necessary standards and enforceable mechanisms through the adoption of the 2021 King County Surface Water Design Manual (KCSWDM Updated 2024). This effort achieves equivalency with Ecology's Stormwater Management Manual for Western Washington. Additionally, Tukwila employs the following applicable local regulations, rules, and standards:

- **TMC 14.30:** Surface and Stormwater Management Code, including adoption of the most current KCSWDM (equivalent to Western Washington Stormwater Management Manual).
- **TMC 8.45:** Code Enforcement
- **TMC 18.45:** Zoning Environmentally Sensitive Areas
- **Tukwila Infrastructure Design and Construction Standards**

The Ecology-approved KCSWDM specifies limitations and criteria used to implement the minimum requirements in Appendix 1 of the Permit to protect water quality and to reduce the discharge of pollutants to the Maximum Extent Practicable (MEP). It also satisfies the State requirement under Chapter 90.48 RCW to apply All Known, Available and Reasonable Methods of Prevention, Control and Treatment (AKART) prior to discharge.

KCSWDM limitations and criteria include:

- Site planning requirements
- Best Management Practice (BMP) selection criteria
- BMP design criteria and limitations
- BMP infeasibility criteria
- LID competing needs criteria
- BMP Operations and maintenance standards

## 8.2 Process for Permitting, Site Plan Review, Inspection and Enforcement

Tukwila administers and reviews site engineering plans and development permits to address clearing, grading, paving, stormwater management system, roadway, and right-of-way activities such as Franchise Utility upgrades to communication and power systems. Furthermore, internal procedures provide for: project approval processing, inspection authority, inspection processes, inspection criteria, pre-acceptance review, re-inspection, and enforcement.

The City's stormwater permitting process involves:

- Review of all stormwater site plans for proposed development activities.
- Inspection, prior to clearing and construction, of all permitted development sites that have a high potential for sediment transport as determined through plan review.
- Inspection of all permitted development sites during construction to verify proper installation and maintenance of required erosion and sediment controls.

- Management of maintenance activities to inspect all stormwater treatment and flow control BMPs/facilities and catch basins in new residential developments every six months, until 90% of the lots are constructed (or when construction has stopped and the site is fully stabilized), to identify maintenance needs and enforce compliance with maintenance standards as needed.
- Inspection of all permitted development sites upon completion of construction and prior to final approval or occupancy to ensure proper installation of permanent stormwater facilities. Verification that a maintenance plan is completed and responsibility for maintenance is assigned for stormwater treatment and flow control BMPs/facilities.
- Compliance with Permit requirements to achieve at least 80% of required inspections.

The Runoff Control program also includes recordkeeping and documentation that uses modular Community Development® e-Gov software, a system that creates stores, and processes all permitting information. Community Development® documents formal permit applications, inspection records, administrative entries, attachments, alerts, project holds and enforcement. Community Development® is tightly linked with the City's GIS system to provide real time tracking status inspection.

### **8.3 Notice of Intent (NOI)**

The City of Tukwila continues to make Notices of Intent (NOI) available to new development and redevelopment proponents and representatives when appropriate. These include NOIs triggered under the NPDES Construction Stormwater General Permit and the NPDES General Industrial Stormwater Permit.

### **8.4 Employee Training**

The City ensures proper formal training (for example CESCL) for all staff whose primary job duties involve Permit-required activities associated with the Development and Construction Runoff Control Program. When necessary, follow-up training occurs in the form of review during routine staff meetings to address changes in procedures, techniques, or staffing. The City documents and maintains all required training records, see Appendix E.

## **9.0 OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE**

To prevent or reduce stormwater impacts, Tukwila implements a Permit-required program to regulate, inspect and document private and public maintenance activities. Implementation of standards under this program are as protective, or more protective, of facility function than those specified in Ecology's Stormwater Management Manual for Western Washington. To meet these requirements, Tukwila uses the 2021 King County Surface Water Design Manual (KCSWDM), and other enforceable mechanisms.

Condition assessments and inspections of private and public stormwater systems involve assessing IDDE potential, measuring sediment levels, evaluating vegetation growth, inspecting for structural damage, and noting defects and problems (see appendix K, annual inspection report). Proper system maintenance is necessary to protect downstream natural resources from flooding and water quality impacts. Private and public facilities and components inspected include, but are not limited to: detention ponds, infiltration facilities, detention tanks/vaults, flow control structures, catch basins and newer green stormwater water quality infrastructure.

## 9.1 Maintenance of Private Stormwater Facilities

Established KCSWDM standards, City ordinances, and other enforceable mechanisms identify requirements and responsibilities for the operation and maintenance of private stormwater systems. Tukwila Public Works has established a program for long-term O&M inspection and enforcement of privately-owned stormwater treatment and flow control BMPs/facilities that discharge to the MS4. The following local regulations apply:

- **TMC 14.28 - 30** Tukwila Surface and Stormwater Management Code
- **TMC 8.45** Code Enforcement

The Private Maintenance Inspection program includes annual inspections of all Permit-regulated facilities (see appendix K, annual inspection report). Scheduled inspections are conducted throughout the year. After inspections, findings are communicated to property owners to indicate the need for corrective action. Remarks and comments documenting each private maintenance inspection are tracked within Trakit© (see Section 9.4).

## 9.2 Maintenance of Public Stormwater Facilities

Public stormwater infrastructure owned or operated by Tukwila includes the system (including roads with drainage systems, municipal streets, catch basins, curbs, gutters, ditches, manmade channels, or storm drains) designed or used for collecting or conveying stormwater (see Appendix K, annual inspection report). Publicly owned assets are inspected to identify structural concerns, sediment levels, or other functional defects. All inspection data are recorded in Lucity©. Permit-required maintenance timelines for public stormwater conveyances include:

- Annual inspection of all stormwater treatment and flow control BMPs/facilities (including but not limited to detention facilities, permanent treatment BMPs/facilities; and bioretention, and permeable pavements).
- Inspection of all catch basin circuits and outfalls every year. This program utilizes location data and GIS capabilities to assess larger drainage systems with limited resources (see appendix D alternative catch basin inspection protocol). An entire circuit is cleaned once the inspections indicate the need.

### 9.2.1 Street Waste Disposal

The City manages the collection and disposal of routine stormwater-related waste (both liquids and solids) that are generated from City-owned property. These wastes are properly disposed of in compliance with Permit requirements, and in accordance with NPDES Permit Appendix 6 - Street Waste Disposal guidelines.

- A limited amount of decant stormwater liquids are discharged into Tukwila sanitary sewer at an approved and permitted Tukwila Maintenance facility trash rack location.
- Uncontaminated solids are transported to KC Renton Decant Station. This disposal facility is available for use by Tukwila to manage and treat uncontaminated MS4 solids.
- PRS Group Washington in Maple Valley, a permitted facility authorized to handle contaminated waste, serves as a disposal option when the KC Renton facility is not available; or when known or suspect contamination is encountered. Regulatory information can be found at <http://www.prsplant.net/Regulatory-Compliance.html>.
- Maintenance and disposal operations are contracted out occasionally on an as-needed basis at some City Facilities.

### 9.2.2 Spot Checks

Tukwila tracks precipitation amounts by using the SeaTac publicly available data. Public Works staff log these data and calculate their running totals (24-hr/10-year recurrence) to determine if major storm events have resulted.

In-person spot checks of all Tukwila-owned stormwater treatment and flow control BMPs/facilities occur immediately after all documented major storm events. Corrective actions are then implemented as needed in accordance with 2021 King County Surface Water Design Manual Maintenance Requirements.

### 9.3 Records Maintenance and Management

Public Works utilizes Lucity© for private and public stormwater systems, which records maintenance and management. Lucity© is a GIS-centric enterprise asset management system that manages, tracks and analyzes stormwater infrastructure assets. Inspectors also use the Community Development software from the Permit Center to track inspections of New Development and Redevelopment sites, Business Source Control and Fats, Oils and Grease wastewater compliance.

### 9.4 Municipal Practices

Tukwila implements stormwater pollution prevention practices that address municipal activities and operations associated with all lands owned or maintained by the City. Affected public lands include streets, parking lots, buildings, parks, open space, road rights-of-way, maintenance yards, and stormwater treatment and flow control BMPs/facilities.

An Interdepartmental Team provides coordination of City-wide efforts to reduce polluted stormwater runoff into and out of municipal drainage systems, facilities and properties to the maximum extent practicable. The team ensures that practices and procedures are fully implemented, and that they comply with the applicable NPDES Permit requirements.

All affected city operations, and activities (including outside contracted work) must adhere to a combination of guidance documents and materials referenced below that describe specific stormwater pollution best management practices which have been adopted for all lands owned or maintained by the City of Tukwila.

- a. **2021 King County Stormwater Design Manual (KC SWDM)**, adopted by Tukwila Municipal Code (TMC) 14.30 and the NPDES Permit (Section S5.C.6.a). This document provides minimum inspection and maintenance requirements (Appendix A) for all publicly and privately owned stormwater treatment and flow control BMPs/facilities and components.
- b. **2021 King County Stormwater Pollution Prevention Manual (SPPM)**. This document provides best management practices (BMPs) for managing stormwater; it lists detailed information and description of actions to prevent/eliminate stormwater, surface water, and groundwater contamination. Municipal-related stormwater pollution prevention practices and procedures covered in the SPPM involve activities such as storage of pesticides and fertilizers, pressure washing, stationary fueling operations, vehicle and equipment repair and maintenance, and snow response operations.
- c. **2016 King County Site Management Plan (KCSiMP1a)**. This document addresses site-specific BMPs: roadway maintenance operations, utility maintenance, maintenance of stormwater facilities, and other right-of-way (ROW) structure work. Maintenance activities covered under these guidelines include, but are not limited to street sweeping, maintaining and cleaning enclosed drainage systems, and mowing bio-swales and cleaning water quality vaults.
- d. **2026 Integrated Pest Management Plan** An Integrated Pest Management (IPM) plan is a sustainable approach to managing pests and noxious weeds by combining biological, cultural, physical, and chemical tools in a way that minimizes economic, health, and environmental risks. The plan is attached as Appendix J.

## 9.5 Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP)

The City implements a written Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) for the Public Works and Parks/Golf Maintenance facilities. These sites function as a heavy equipment maintenance and material storage yards subject to Permit requirements. The SWPPP was updated in 2022 to fully meet permit requirements per S5.C.8.f. The SWPPP includes the following information:

- A detailed description of the operational and structural BMPs in use.
- A BMP implementation schedule.
- Annual inspections of the facility (including visual observations of discharges, to evaluate the effectiveness of the BMPs).
- Activities conducted at the facility which may be exposed to precipitation or runoff and could result in stormwater pollution.
- A site map showing the facility's stormwater drainage, discharge points, and areas of potential pollutant exposure from the materials and equipment stored on-site.
- A plan for preventing and responding to facility spill incidents and maintenance needs.

## 9.6 Stormwater Pollution Prevention Training (SWPPP)

The City implements an ongoing stormwater BMP training program (Appendix E) for all Tukwila employees that conduct municipal-related job functions that may impact stormwater quality (building inspection, construction, operations, or maintenance). Training addresses the importance of protecting water quality, operation and maintenance standards, inspection procedures, relevant SWPPPs, selection of appropriate BMPs, ways to perform job activities to prevent or minimize impacts to water quality, and procedures for reporting water quality concerns. Follow-up training is provided as needed to address changes in procedures, techniques, requirements, or staffing, which may include annual refreshers and informal training in the form of staff meetings. The City documents and maintains municipal-related training records, including dates, activities, course descriptions, and names and positions of staff in attendance.

## 10.0 SOURCE CONTROL FOR EXISTING DEVELOPMENT

In 2026, the City will continue to fully implement our Permit-required Business Source Control Program to prevent and reduce contamination discharging into the MS4 from stormwater pollution generating sites and businesses in Tukwila (see appendix K, annual inspection report).. Elements of the Source Control Program include:

- Developing an inventory that includes approximately 793 privately owned institutional, commercial, and industrial sites which have the potential to generate pollutants to the MS4 and local surface waters.
- Performing annual inspections on a minimum of 20% of the total inventory sites (158).
- Establishing effective BMPs for each individual site to control pollution potentially discharging into the MS4 utilizing the KC Surface Water Pollution Prevention manual.
- Implementing a progressive enforcement program that requires sites to comply within a reasonable period and ensuring they have the technical assistance to comply.
- Providing ongoing staff training for those responsible for implementing the source control program and providing escalating enforcement to businesses slow to implement BMPs up to and including fines and cost-recovery for actions the Municipality must conduct.

To help continue the implementation of the new program, stormwater personnel participate in the Business Inspection Group (BIG), a collaborative group of municipal stormwater permittees hosted by the Washington Stormwater Center. BIG periodically convenes to share resources

and guidance on best practices, enforcement strategies, public education, and inspection tracking and management.

## 11.0 MONITORING AND ASSESSMENT

The Department of Ecology-facilitated Stormwater Action Monitoring (SAM) forum helps municipal stormwater permittees understand and develop water quality monitoring strategies required under Western Washington municipal stormwater permits. SAM provides structure, transparency, and accountability for permittees and stakeholders. The group also aims to improve stormwater management, reduce pollution, improve water quality, and reduce flooding. City representatives participate in the SAM process to select studies that have a profound effect on the effort to reduce pollutant discharge to the Puget Sound from MS4.

The City of Tukwila meets Permit monitoring and assessment requirements by paying into an Ecology-managed collective fund that finances the following programs:

S8.A – Regional Status and Trends Monitoring, the City has paid **\$5,655**.

S8.B –Effectiveness and Source Identification Studies, the City has paid **\$8,369**.

The **total fee of \$14,024** is variable and due each year by August 15 until the permit expiration date of July 31, 2029. This amount may be adjusted in the future depending on the growth in Tukwila according to the total housing units available each year. The completed payment coupon is attached to Appendix G.

## 12.0 REPORTING REQUIREMENTS (SPECIAL CONDITION S9)

No later than March 31 of each year, the City of Tukwila submits an electronic Annual Report to Ecology's Water Quality Permitting Portal (WQWebPortal). The Annual Report covers activities performed during the previous calendar year. Each Annual Report includes the following:

- A copy of Tukwila's current SWMP Plan.
- As provided by Ecology, the Annual Report form documents the SWMP Plan implementation status during the reporting period.
- Attachments include summaries, reports, and other information as applicable.
- Certification and signature pursuant to G19.D, and notification of any changes to authorization pursuant to G19.C.

### 12.1 Annual Report

The City must post the 2026 SWMP Plan by May 31 to the City website and the 2025 annual report State Secure Access Washington Account by March 31. This makes the most current Annual Report and SWMP Plan available on the Tukwila Stormwater Management Program Webpage by the required date of May 31. The City of Tukwila keeps all records related to the Permit and the SWMP for at least five years. All records related to the Permit and the SWMP are made available to the public at reasonable times during business hours. The City will provide a copy of the most recent Annual Report upon request to any individual or entity (a reasonable cost is charged for making photocopies of records) pursuant to national security directives. The City may require an advanced notice of intent to review Permit-related records. For your convenience and due to the stark difference between the Annual Report contained in Appendix 3 and the online SAW Account required by the Department of Ecology, the full Appendix 3 Annual Report version is attached here as Appendix I.

## CONCLUSION

The current Permit expires July 31, 2029. This SWMP Plan is a working document with updates annually. The City will be developing and updating many policies, programs and procedures to meet the new permit requirements. ## **New State Requirements contained in '24 – '29 Permit**

This document summarizes the new requirements within the latest iteration of 5-year term NPDES permits applicable to the City of Tukwila. Program managers and staff are working to respond to these new requirements with new or adjusted programs, new or revised capital improvement plans or actions necessary to be compliant with the new permit and carrying forward existing programming that was required by past permit cycles.

### **S5.C1 Stormwater Planning**

**March 31, 2027 - S5.C.1.d.i** No later than March 31, 2027, complete a SMAP for at least one new high priority catchment area, or additional actions for an existing SMAP. The purpose of the SMAP is to support implementation in the SMED program with the identification of strategic investments through the identification of projects and actions.

**December 31, 2028 - S5.C.1.c.iii** Adopt and implement tree canopy goals and policies to support stormwater management.

### **S5.C2 Public Education and Outreach**

**July 1, 2025 - S5.C.2.a.ii.b** Based on the recommendation from the 2024 evaluate and report, follow social marketing practices and methods and develop a campaign that is tailored to the community, including development of a program evaluation plan.

**September 1, 2025 - S5.C.2.a.ii.c** Begin to implement the strategy developed in C.2.a.ii.b.

### **S5.C3 Public Involvement and Participation**

**December 31, 2026 -S5.C.3.a.ii** Document methods used to identify overburdened communities.

### **S5.C4 MS4 Mapping and Documentation**

**March 31, 2026 - S5.C.4.b.i** Submit locations of all known MS4 outfalls according to the standard templates and format provided in the Annual Report. This report shall include the size and material of the outfalls.

**December 31, 2026 - S5.C.4.b.ii** Using available, existing data, map tree canopy to support stormwater management on Permittee-owned or operated properties. Develop and follow a methodology to intentionally identify canopy for stormwater management purposes, which may be updated annually or as needed.

**December 31, 2028 - S5.C.4.b.iii** Implement a methodology to map and assess acreage of MS4 tributary basins to outfalls with a 24-inch nominal diameter or larger, or an equivalent cross-sectional area for non-pipe systems that have stormwater treatment and flow controls BMPs/facilities owned or operated by the Permittee. Submit with the Annual Report a map and

breakdown of acres managed or unmanaged by stormwater treatment and flow control BMPs/facilities.

**S5.C.4.b.iv** Using available, existing data map overburdened communities in relation to stormwater treatment and flow control BMPs/facilities, outfalls, discharge points, and tree canopy on Permittee-owned or operated properties.

#### **S5.C5 Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination**

**July 2, 2027 – S5.C5.c** Each Permittee shall implement an ordinance or other regulatory mechanism to effectively prohibit non-stormwater, illicit discharges into the Permittee’s MS4 to the maximum extent allowable under state and federal law. The ordinance or other regulatory mechanism in effect as of the effective date of this Permit shall be revised, if necessary, to meet the requirements of this Section no later than July 1, 2027.

#### **S5.C6 Controlling Runoff from New Development, Redevelopment and Construction**

**June 30, 2027 - Appendix 10** Identifies the exemptions, definitions related to the Minimum Requirements, applicability of the Minimum Requirements that need to be included in the ECY-equivalent stormwater management manual.

#### **S5.C7 Stormwater Management for Existing Development**

**March 31, 2028 - S5.C.7.b** With each annual report, provide a list of planned individual projects scheduled for funding or implementation during the Permit term for the purpose of meeting the assigned equivalent acreage in Appendix 12 using the formatting specified in Appendix 12.

**March 31, 2028 - S5.C.7.c** Fully fund, start construction, or completely implement projects(s) that meet the Permittee’s equivalent acreage and submit documentation with the Annual Report.

**March 31, 2028 - S5.C.7.e** Report the amount of estimated or projected equivalent acres managed by stormwater facility retrofits for the 2029-2034 Permit term.

#### **S5.C8 Source Control Program for Existing Development**

**August 1, 2027 - S5.C.8.a** Update and make effective the ordinances(s) or other enforceable documents, as necessary to meet S5.C.8.

#### **S5.C9 Operations and Maintenance**

**March 31, 2028 - S5.C.9.e.v** Document and report: (a) mapped priority areas swept, (b) sweeping dates, (c) sweeping frequency, (d) type of sweeper, (e) total curb miles of priority areas and curb miles swept, and (f) approximation of street waste removed for each sweeping event.

**June 30, 2027 - S5.C.9.a** Implement maintenance standards that are as protective of facility function as specified in the SWMMWW or an Ecology-approved Phase I program. Update maintenance standards as necessary.

**December 31, 2027 - S5.C.9.x.v.a** Document policies, practices, or procedures to reduce stormwater impacts associated with runoff from all lands owned or operated by the Permittee including: Source control BMPs to minimize PCBs from entering the MS4. The Permittee shall not discharge washdown water to the MS4 for buildings suspected of having PCB-containing materials.

**December 31, 2027 - S5.C.9.xvi.a** Update policies, practices, or procedures to include source control BMPs for building materials to prevent PCBs from entering the MS4 in preparation for and during demolition and renovations.

**July 1, 2027 - S5.C.9.e.i** Apply a street sweeping program to Permittee owned roads in high priority MS4 drainage areas discharging to outfalls and meet any of the following criteria (a) high traffic streets, such as arterials or collectors, (b) Streets that serve commercial or industrial land use areas.

**July 1, 2027 - S5.C.9.e.ii** Sweep high priority areas at least once between July and September each year and two additional times a year as determined by the Permittee to provide additional water quality benefits. For calendar year 2027, only one sweeping event is required.

**July 1, 2027 - S5.C.9.e.ii.a** Annually sweep, and document, at least 90% of high priority areas each sweeping event.

**July 1, 2027 - S5.C.9.e.iii** Follow equipment design performance specifications to ensure that street sweeping equipment is operated at the proper design speed with appropriate verification, and that it is properly maintained.

There are many other Appendices to the permit that include many other requirements stacked on the requirements listed above. Our Interdepartmental Team will be assessing and addressing these extended requirements and expectations to be certain that all conditions are addressed.

**STATEMENT OF POLICY:** City departments are required to coordinate internally to ensure that all aspects and elements of the NPDES program are being fulfilled.

**DEFINITIONS:**

City: means the city of Tukwila.

Coordinator: means the City's Public Works Director, or designee.

Department: means any City of Tukwila department or division that engages in activities or programs that are subject the NPDES permit.

Liaison: means the designee of any Department that is responsible for ensuring the department's compliance with the NPDES permit.

NPDES: means National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System.

**POLICY:**

**Section A:** The City operates under the NPDES through a municipal stormwater permit issued by the Washington State Department of Ecology. To ensure that the City is fully complying with the NPDES permit, each department in the City is responsible for implementing applicable compliance activities. This policy is established to ensure that each City department coordinates with other City departments in order to assure compliance with the NPDES permit requirements as follows:


1. The City's Public Works Department shall be responsible for coordinating the City's municipal permit compliance activities.
2. The following departments have been determined by the Coordinator to have activities that are regulated the NPDES permit:
  - a. Public Works Engineering

- b. Public Works General Operations and Maintenance (inc. Streets, Fleet & Facilities)
  - c. Public Works Utilities Maintenance
  - d. Parks & Recreation
  - e. Department of Community Development
  - f. Fire Department
  - g. City Attorney’s Office
3. Departments engaging in any activities or programs that the Coordinator determines may be subject to or could support compliance with the municipal permit is required to comply with applicable municipal permit requirements.
  4. Each department subject to the municipal permit shall designate a Liaison to manage that department’s municipal permit requirements and coordinate as appropriate with the Coordinator.
  5. Coordination framework and expectations:
    - a. Liaisons shall be familiar with municipal permit requirements that are applicable to their department.
    - b. The Coordinator and Liaisons shall develop city-wide protocols to ensure compliance with applicable municipal permit requirements.
    - c. The Coordinator and Liaisons shall work together to implement any municipal permit requirement activities.
    - d. Liaisons shall communicate regularly with the Coordinator on the status of applicable compliance activities.
    - e. The Coordinator and Liaisons shall prepare and provide submittals to Ecology to comply with municipal permit requirements. Submittals include, but are not limited to, annual reports, stormwater management program (SWMP) plans, compliance reports and other submittals as required by Ecology.
    - f. Upon request from the Coordinator, Liaisons shall provide information regarding department-specific compliance activities in a timely manner.

# Surface Water Utility Capital Improvement Program (2025–2030)

The Surface Water Utility Fund (412) supports the City of Tukwila’s stormwater management infrastructure, regulatory compliance, flood protection, and ecological restoration goals. The 2025–2030 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) includes a broad suite of projects designed to reduce flooding, improve stormwater quality, restore aquatic habitat, and ensure compliance with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit.

Over six years, Fund 412 plans to invest \$64.37 million in stormwater capital projects. [\[1\]](#) Below is a high-level summary of key project categories and their stormwater quality benefits.

## 1. Drainage Improvement & Flood Reduction Projects

These projects address aging or undersized infrastructure, flooding, erosion, and conveyance reliability.

Key Projects:

- S 131st Pl Drainage Improvements – Major re-alignment of Southgate Creek to reduce flooding, sedimentation, and property impacts. [\[1\]](#)
- Annual Small Drainage Program – Citywide minor drainage fixes, culvert upgrades, and small-scale water quality improvements. [\[1\]](#)
- Nelsen/Longacres Phase II – New 48-inch conveyance pipe under BNSF to reduce localized flooding and improve stormwater movement. [\[1\]](#)
- S 143rd St Storm System – Full drainage redesign with bioswales and treatment, reducing roadway and private property flooding. [\[1\]](#)
- S 146th St & 35th Ave S Drainage System – Replaces failing pipes and increases capacity to reduce chronic flooding. [\[1\]](#)

Stormwater Quality Benefit:

Enhanced conveyance reduces pollutant-laden runoff ponding, improves infiltration, and reduces sediment mobilization into waterways.

## 2. Water Quality Retrofit & Treatment Projects

These projects add water quality treatment where stormwater previously drained untreated and qualify as Stormwater Management for Existing Development towards the assigned acreage of 3.6 acres.

### Key Projects:

- Stormwater Water Quality Retrofit Program – Citywide upgrades including treatment vaults, biofiltration systems, and conveyance retrofits. [\[1\]](#)
- Riverton SMAP Retrofits – Required under NPDES to implement basin-specific water quality enhancements such as bio-retention planters and roadway retrofits. [\[1\]](#)
- WSDOT Stormwater Retrofit Program – Local treatment installations targeting highway runoff impacts. [\[1\]](#)
- Fort Dent Park Water Quality Retrofit – Addresses emerging pollutants like 6PPD-q from artificial turf runoff. [\[1\]](#)
- Tukwila Pond Water Quality Improvement Project – Long-term plan to treat runoff entering Tukwila Pond and improve downstream water quality. [\[1\]](#)

### Stormwater Quality Benefit:

Reduces sediment, nutrient, heavy metal, and emerging pollutants entering Tukwila’s rivers, creeks, and ponds.

## 3. Habitat Restoration & Fish Passage Projects

These projects restore natural processes, improve habitat, and remove barriers to fish migration.

### Key Projects:

- Gilliam Creek Fish Barrier Removal & Habitat Enhancement – Large multi-year salmon passage restoration project. [\[1\]](#)
- Nelsen Side Channel Restoration – Reconnects historic off-channel habitat along the Green River. [\[1\]](#)
- Duwamish Hill Preserve Phase 3 – Expands shoreline habitat, improves shallow water habitat, and enhances public access. [\[1\]](#)
- Chinook Wind Extension & Public Access Project – Habitat and trail improvements in coordination with salmon recovery efforts. [\[1\]](#)
- Fish Passage Barrier Prioritization Study – Creates a prioritized list to guide future barrier removal. [\[1\]](#)
- Johnson Creek Fish Barrier Mitigation Study – Defines solutions to improve fish passage from tributaries. [\[1\]](#)

Stormwater Quality Benefit:

Restored habitat improves natural filtration, reduces sedimentation, stabilizes streambanks, and supports salmon recovery.

## 4. Levee & Riverfront Resilience Projects

Projects that enhance flood protection and increase river system resilience.

Key Projects:

- Levee Program (500-year protection) – Rebuild, certify, and maintain levees critical for flood protection and water quality stability. [\[1\]](#)
- Lower Green Riverfront Master Plan – Guides aesthetics, public access, and habitat considerations during upcoming federal and county flood projects. [\[1\]](#)
- P17 Pond & Southcenter Hydraulic Study – Evaluates alternatives to support levee setbacks for additional habitat uplift. [\[1\]](#)

Stormwater Quality Benefit:

Stable levees reduce erosion events and pollutant loading into the Green River.

## 5. Regulatory Compliance & Programmatic Requirements

These projects ensure ongoing compliance with NPDES and support planning needs.

Key Projects:

- NPDES Program – City’s core programmatic compliance effort including reporting, monitoring, spill response, and inspections. [\[1\]](#)
- Enhanced Maintenance Plan (EMP) – Required for grant funding and improves pollutant removal through better O&M practices. [\[1\]](#)
- Comprehensive Landslide Risk Assessment – Identifies slope instability that could introduce sediment and pollutants into waterways. [\[1\]](#)
- Regional Surface Water Partnerships – Participation in WRIA 9, USGS stream gages, and stewardship programs. [\[1\]](#)

Stormwater Quality Benefit:

Improves pollutant tracking, reporting accuracy, and ensures the City meets all federal/state water quality requirements.

## 6. Green Infrastructure & Restoration Stewardship

Projects addressing vegetation, tree canopy, and restoration maintenance.

Key Projects:

- Green the Green Program – Riparian enhancements to reduce stream temperatures and improve water quality. [\[1\]](#)
- Green Infrastructure Program (GIP) – Establishes staffing and processes for citywide restoration stewardship, tree canopy expansion, and open space conservation. [\[1\]](#)

#### Stormwater Quality Benefit:

Tree canopy and native vegetation improve filtration, lower temperatures, reduce erosion, and enhance watershed hydrology.

## Alternative Catch Basin Inspection Protocol 2026

Section 5 Chapter 9 (S5.C9) of the NPDES Phase II Western Washington permit spells out the requirements for public and private stormwater management including inspections, maintenance and documentation. The City of Tukwila is required to “**implement and document** a program to regulate maintenance activities and to conduct maintenance activities” to **prevent** and **reduce** stormwater impacts on receiving waters within its jurisdiction. This chapter deals with the work directly related to the structures and pipes that convey floodwater away from roadways and properties where it is discharged to groundwater, wetlands, creeks, streams and ultimately the Green/Duwamish river.

The minimum performance measures of S5.C9.a are:

- Develop or Adopt and use a maintenance standard that is “as protective or more protective than” the Western Washington Stormwater Management Manual for Western Washington OR a Phase I jurisdictions equivalent manual.
  - The City uses the King County Surface Water Design manual and King County Site Management Plan to manage rights-of-way and City Properties.
- Update the maintenance standard if needed to meet this permit.
  - The City follows the King County update process as timely as possible.
- Inspections are required by S5.C9.b.i.b and actions to address maintenance needs should be taken on the timeline provided.
  - The City addresses maintenance need as prescribed and typically much more quickly than allowed, which is: Within 6 months for CBs, one (1) year for typical maintenance; two (2) years for maintenance that requires capital construction costing less than \$25,000.

The City of Tukwila conducts MS4 inspections using a combined approach allowed under S5.C9.c Maintenance of stormwater facilities owned or operated by the Permittee. The City is just over nine (9) square miles with significant topography changes within the lower WRIA 9 Green/Duwamish watershed (~430 sq. mi.) immediately upstream of the City of Seattle and the Lower Duwamish Waterway.

To make good use of limited resources such as staff and equipment, and to meet Union preservation of available work, the City is divided into Five (5) "Maintenance Zones" which encompass up to two (2) square miles each and up to dozens of Ecology defined “circuits” draining to a single discharge point. This divides the City into manageable districts that combine work of similar conditions, such as flat valley floors, or steep valley slopes, mostly residential or mostly commercial, to allow the crew to determine the type of equipment needed and prioritize the most vulnerable areas of drainage systems.

To meet S5.C9.c.i the Operations and Maintenance Stormwater crew:

- Inspects all Municipally Owned and Operated Stormwater Treatment and Flow controls once annually at a minimum.
- Notes are taken on all inspections and actions to remedy maintenance conditions are logged into the CMMS Lucity©.
- No reduction of inspection frequency is required.

To meet S5.C9.c.ii the Operations and Maintenance division:

- Conducts weather related inspections of critical infrastructure and land features including outfalls whenever rain exceeds the standard (24-hour, 10-year), typically crews are already engaged at the 2-year storm.
- Take notes on all inspections and actions to remedy maintenance conditions which are logged into the CMMS Lucity©;
- Repairs are conducted on an ability basis, whereby when staff are able, they repair the situation immediately, when unable, they report the condition to the CIP program for remedy in the Small Drainage CIP system to be repaired within two (2) years taking actions to minimize further damage until repair can be completed.

To meet S5.C9.c.iii the Operations and Maintenance Stormwater division:

- Cleans two (2) maintenance zones per year, totaling nearly 4 square miles of service area, typically including more than 500 structures and dozens of Ecology defined circuits including maintenance at all outfalls.
- Typically, this approach meets S5.C9.c.iii.c since most circuits within a Maintenance Zone are cleaned once during the permit term if not within 2 years.

Additionally, to meet S5.C9.c.iii Environmental Compliance inspectors:

- Inspect 25% of catch basins within Ecology defined circuits, reporting total sump depth in the circuit divided by the total sediment impacted sump depth as a percentage.
- Once a single circuit reaches 60% of total sump depth impacted by sediment the circuit is reported to Operations and Maintenance for cleaning within the next 6 months, typically much sooner if not within weeks of the report.
- Outfalls are also inspected during this effort with damages reported similarly.

All City field staff are IDDE trained using the currently required Ecology manual, allowing staff to report when suspected Illicit Discharges are found within the MS4 or seen being allowed on private property. Drainage inspectors respond to IDDE reports and have the discharged material eliminated (removed from the system) by the responsible party.

NPDES Training is also accomplished in the field during field activities to reinforce the training.

Training (records to be kept include dates, activities or course descriptions, and names and positions of staff in attendance.) “Qualified Personnel” means someone who has had training in the aspects of stormwater management for which they are responsible and are under the functional control of the Permittee. They may be staff members, contractors, or volunteers.

## **Stormwater Management for Existing Development — Synopsis**

The City of Tukwila’s **Stormwater Management for Existing Development (SMED)** program fulfills requirements in the Western Washington Phase II NPDES Permit, which mandates that cities implement long-term strategies to reduce stormwater impacts from **existing public development**—including roads, sidewalks, parks, and other City-owned property.

### **Permit Requirement**

The City must:

- Retrofit stormwater systems to reduce pollutant discharge.
- Provide an annual list of planned projects.
- Meet an assigned retrofit credit of **3.6 acres** by **March 31, 2028**.

Tukwila has already exceeded this by completing **3.8 acres** of retrofits (Site 5A Interurban Ave and Site 8A Tukwila International Blvd).

### **Programs That Contribute to SMED**

Tukwila uses several existing programs to meet SMED goals:

1. **Capital Improvement Program (CIP) – 412 Fund & 301 Fund**
2. **Small Drainage Program**
3. **Stormwater Management Action Plan (SMAP)**
4. **Stormwater Outfall Water Quality Retrofit Program**

Each program identifies structural and non-structural investments that improve **water quality, flow control, and aquatic habitat**, consistent with the Surface Water Comprehensive Plan.

# Integrated Pest Management Plan

An Integrated Pest Management (IPM) plan is a sustainable approach to managing pests and noxious weeds by combining biological, cultural, physical, and chemical tools in a way that minimizes economic, health, and environmental risks. This plan was prepared by Tukwila staff using the [Tri-County Integrated Pest and Vegetation Management Guidelines, published August 12, 1999](#).

This plan is divided into four parts to address the separate sections of operations within the City of Tukwila and several city departments. They are:

- **Public Works:** responsible for IPM within rights of way, utility system properties.
- **Parks/Golf:** responsible for IPM within Parks, the Golf Course, City facilities.
- **Department of Community Development:** responsible for communicating IPM to private residential, commercial and industrial properties.
- **Green Tukwila Partnership:** responsible for educating and providing stewardship opportunities to community members and volunteers.

The guidelines include chapters covering: Planning and Design, Maintenance for maximum landscape health, Knowing the pest, Determining tolerance thresholds, Monitoring for pests, Developing the IPM plan, Implementing the IPM Plan and selected strategies, Monitoring and evaluation, Learning and revision.

## 1. Assessment and Monitoring

- **Identify Pests:** Conduct regular surveys to identify the types of pests or noxious weeds affecting parks, golf courses, soccer facilities, city facilities and rights of way.
- **Monitor Pest Populations:** Use traps, visual inspections, and reports from community members to monitor pest populations and their impact.
- **Map infestation areas:** Use GIS to catalog areas that are impacted by noxious weeds, pest infestations, or combination problems. Grade the areas on a scale of 1-5 where 1 is the least impacted and 5 is the most impacted. Track these areas through repeat inspections and scores over 1-3 times per year.

## 2. Prevention

- **Cultural Practices:**
  - **Golf Course:** Implement proper mowing, irrigation, and fertilization practices to maintain healthy turf that is less susceptible to pests. Collect and properly dispose of all landscaping wastes to avoid discharge to the riverine and near shore environments.

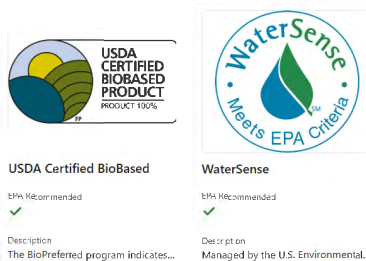
- **Soccer Facility:** Ensure proper drainage and aeration to prevent pest-friendly environments. Limit food wastes in open areas that attract pests. For Artificial turf, limit cleaning and sanitation wastes from the underdrain system and use a diverting pump when undertaking major cleaning.
- **Community:** Promote cleanliness and proper waste management to reduce pest habitats and discharge of solid waste. Use Dumpster Outreach Group messaging to encourage better trash management and eliminate discharge of solid and liquid waste to the environment and stormwater systems.
- Avoid planting invasives in landscaping areas adjacent to natural areas or within shorelines.
- **Physical Barriers:**
  - Install barriers such as screens and fences to prevent pests from entering key areas.
  - Use mulches and ground covers to deter pests in landscaped areas and rights of way.
  - Use weed blocking barriers and targeted drip irrigation to reduce the need for herbicide use.

### 3. Biological Controls

- **Natural Predators:** Introduce or encourage natural predators such as birds, beneficial insects, and nematodes to control pest populations.
- **Biological Pesticides:** Use biopesticides derived from natural materials like plants, bacteria, and certain minerals.

### 4. Chemical Controls

- **Selective Pesticides:** When necessary, use pesticides that target specific pests to minimize harm to beneficial organisms and the environment. Use the following certificated products:



- **Application Timing:** Apply pesticides during times when pests are most vulnerable and beneficial organisms are least active.

### 5. Education and Community Involvement

- **Training:** Provide training for community members, golf course staff, and soccer facility personnel on IPM practices.

- **Awareness Campaigns:** Conduct awareness campaigns to educate Tukwila Citizens about the importance of IPM and how they can contribute.
- **Public Involvement:** Provide environmental education and stewardship opportunities through community organized events and restoration projects. Tukwila enacted Resolution No. 1906 on March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2017, the Green Tukwila Partnership whose mission is to engage the community in caring for healthy forested parks and natural open space in the city.

## 6. Evaluation and Adjustment

- **Regular Review:** Regularly review the effectiveness of the IPM plan and adjust as needed based on monitoring data and community feedback.
- **Adaptive Management:** Be flexible and ready to adopt better strategies as pest populations and environmental conditions change.

## Implementation Steps

1. **Form an IPM Committee:** Include representatives from Parks, Public Works, golf course members and users, and soccer facility personnel and users. Certified Public Operators within the Washington State Department of Agriculture
2. **Develop a Monitoring Schedule:** Establish a routine for pest and noxious weed monitoring and data collection in GIS, Lucity Work Orders and other systems.
3. **Set Action Thresholds:** Define levels of pest activity and noxious weed infestations that will trigger specific management actions.
4. **Implement Control Measures:** Apply the appropriate cultural, biological, and chemical controls as needed.
5. **Evaluation and Report:** Regularly evaluate the effectiveness of the IPM plan and report findings to the community.

By following this plan, Tukwila effectively manages pests and noxious weeds in a sustainable and environmentally friendly manner, ensuring the health and well-being of both Tukwila residents, city owned facilities and public rights of way.

## Strategies for Community Involvement

Involving the community more deeply in the Integrated Pest Management (IPM) plan can enhance its effectiveness and foster a sense of ownership and responsibility. Tukwila offers residents and other interested parties stewardship opportunities through our Green Tukwila Partnership (GTP). Volunteers can learn about wildlife, native trees, shrubs, invasive plants, how to use tools, and much more. Environmental education and ecological restoration work parties are in-person learning sessions conducted on actual projects that remove invasives and replant beneficial species. Community members and businesses learn how to care for precious urban forests and ensure healthy, safe, and beautiful public spaces for the future.

## 1. Community Workshops and Training Sessions

- **Educational Workshops:** GTP Organizes regular workshops to educate community members about IPM practices, pest identification, and prevention techniques.
- **Hands-On Training:** GTP Provides practical training sessions where community members can learn and practice IPM methods.

## 2. Volunteer Programs

- **Pest Monitoring Volunteers:** GTP Recruits volunteers to help with pest monitoring and data collection. This can include setting up and checking traps, conducting surveys, and reporting findings.
- **Community Clean-Up Days:** GTP Organizes clean-up events to reduce pest habitats by removing litter, managing waste, and maintaining public spaces.

## 3. Communication and Feedback Channels

- **Regular Meetings:** GTP Holds regular community meetings to discuss IPM progress, share updates, and gather feedback.

- **Tilling:** Tilling the soil can disrupt weed growth, but it should be done carefully to avoid spreading weed seeds.

### 3. Chemical Control

- **Herbicides:** Use selective herbicides that target specific weeds without harming desirable plants. Follow label instructions carefully to minimize environmental impact.
- **Spot Treatment:** Apply herbicides directly to individual weeds to reduce the amount of chemicals used and limit damage to surrounding vegetation.

### 4. Cultural Practices

- **Mulching:** Apply mulch to suppress weed growth by blocking sunlight and creating a barrier.
- **Planting Competitive Species:** Introduce native or desirable plants that can outcompete noxious weeds for resources.

### 5. Biological Control

- **Natural Predators:** Introduce insects or animals that feed on specific noxious weeds. This method requires careful planning to avoid unintended ecological impacts.
- **Pathogens:** Use naturally occurring pathogens that specifically target noxious weeds.

## 6. Preventative Measures

- **Regular Monitoring:** Conduct regular inspections to detect and address weed infestations early.
- **Proper Disposal:** Dispose of removed weeds properly to prevent them from spreading. Avoid composting noxious weeds as they may survive and spread.

### Implementation Steps

1. **Identify Weeds:** Accurately identify the noxious weeds present in the community spaces such as Parks, Golf Course, Soccer Center, Road Rights of Way landscaping.
2. **Choose Appropriate Methods:** Select the most suitable combination of methods based on the type and extent of the infestation.
3. **Develop a Schedule:** Create a schedule for regular monitoring and maintenance to keep weed populations under control.
4. **Engage the Community:** Involve community members in weed removal efforts through volunteer programs and educational campaigns.
5. **Evaluate and Adjust:** Regularly assess the effectiveness of the weed management strategies and adjust as needed.

By using a combination of these methods, Tukwila effectively manages pests and noxious weeds and maintains healthy, attractive community spaces.

## Training and Certification

Tukwila staff are Certified as Public Operators with the Washington Department of Agriculture pesticide applicators program. They are trained in proper application methods and record keeping of all applications.

Tukwila conducts many types of inspections in several categories. This appendix to the 2026 Surface Water Management Program Plan summarizes all inspections across all inspection efforts. This includes pre-construction, construction pollution prevention and erosion control, post-construction, annual drainage inspection, business source control, illicit discharge follow up, fats, oils, and grease compliance (FOG) and used cooking oil containment conducted by Building Department, Operations and Maintenance and Environmental Compliance.

All city field personnel and building department inspectors, contract inspectors and volunteers are trained to recognize and report illicit discharges (IDDE) to the city spill hotline at (206) 433-1860 option 5. Environmental compliance inspectors conduct IDDE inspections and work with the responsible party (RP) to clean out the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) and make reports to Ecology Report Tracking System. If the RP is unable to act in a timely manner, EC inspectors call O&M staff to conduct cleaning at the RP's expense as required by TMC 14.30 and 8.45. Once a property has a history of IDDE and problems with storm drainage inspectors add the site to a regular 'patrol' route to confirm that the activity or condition has been fully abated and does not continue.

## Appendix L 2025 Behavior Change Program

Tukwila employs many campaigns to effect behavior change with regards to stormwater given in past permit cycles and within the needs of the community. Tukwila has a unique topography which drives some of these programs. Education and Outreach efforts, Technical Assistance, Business Source Control inspections, contacts made through addressing spills and illicit discharges and staff teaching at regional education events like Burien's Stormfest all have an element of Behavior Change. The recent permit update required Tukwila to develop or adopt a new, specific Behavior Change program that has evaluation and reporting elements.

Tukwila has a very limited government and must rely on grants and contractors and consultants for much of its programming across all divisions. As such, Tukwila elected to join the National "Adopt A Drain" program administered by Hamline University, like many other Washington Cities, as its newly required Behavior Change program. This is the strategy selected for this latest effort, now named Behavior Change. We still conduct all the past efforts, like Puget Sound Starts Here, Don't Drip and Drive, Don't Wait to Inflate, Only Rain down the Drain, Drain Raingers drain marker installation, Technical Assistance to all residents managing surface waters, Natural Yard Care and many others.

The schedule for the program is ongoing, like the many other efforts. We constantly advertise the Adopt A Drain and Puget Sound Starts Here programs at Council Meetings, at Community Outreach events, tabling events, utility billing inserts and within the Green Tukwila Partnership work parties. The following is this year's assessment of the Adopt A Drain and Puget Sound Starts Here programs, as required by NPDES '24-'29.

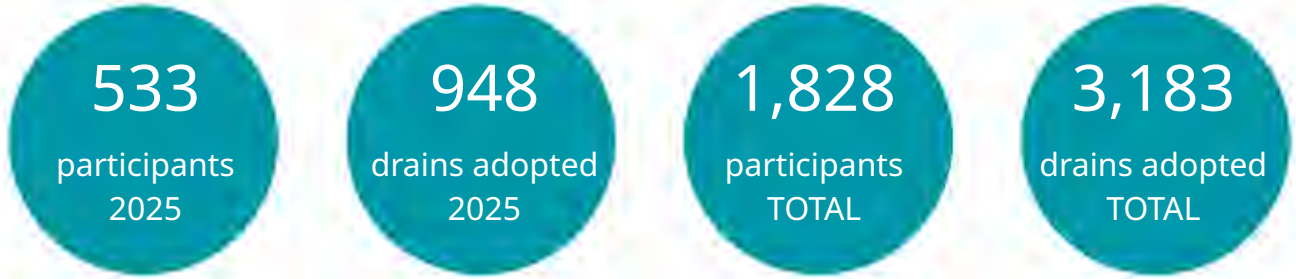

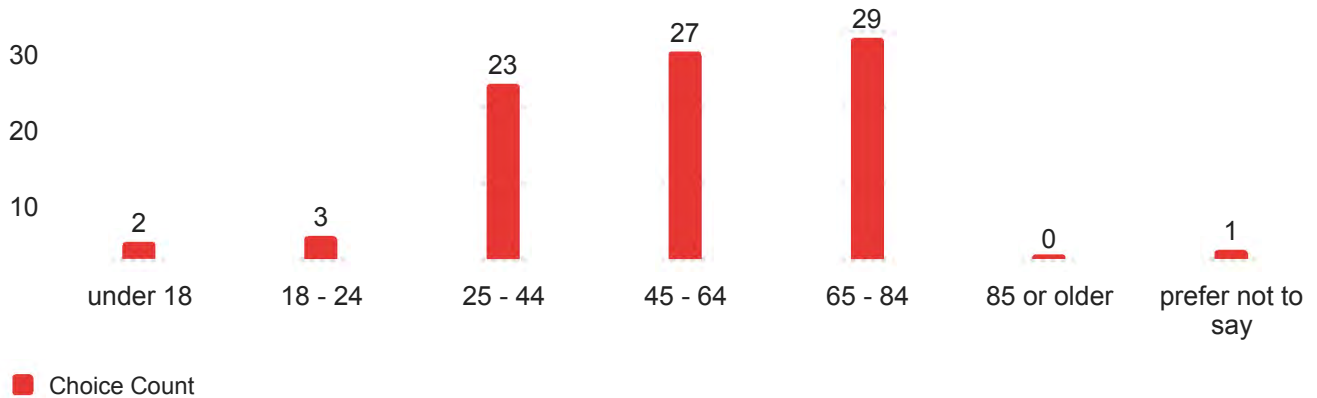

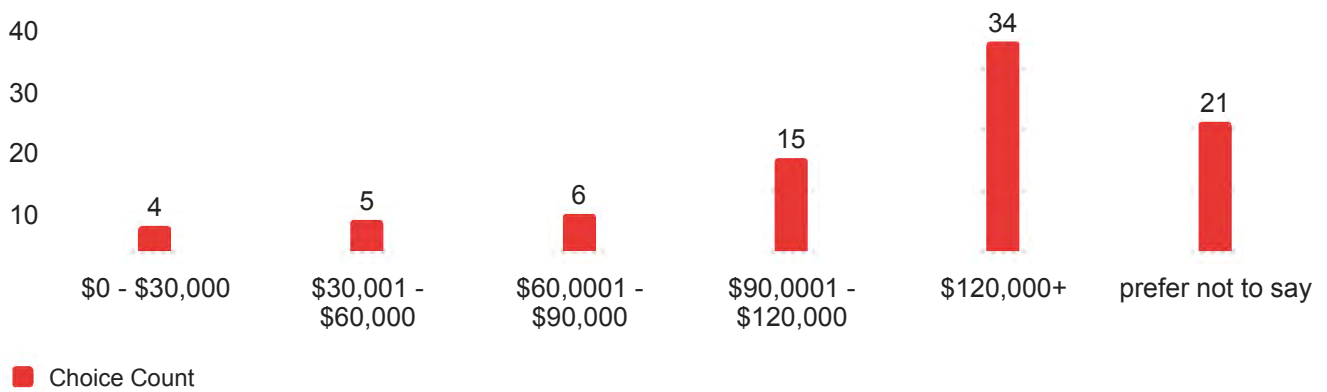

## BACKGROUND: AWARENESS & BEHAVIOR CHANGE

The [Don't Wait to Inflate](#) campaign, as part of the annual Puget Sound Starts Here clean water awareness effort, ran November through December 2025. The campaign introduces the [tire chemical toxic to salmon](#), 6PPDq, as part of a safety and money saving driving [message research](#) and strategy. The messages emphasize safety, savings and protecting salmon through proper tire inflation. [Research on tire inflation](#) shows a reduction in tire crumb.

The 2026 campaign continues to build on and learn from the initial audience and message research from the 2023 campaign design. Post 2020-2021 COVID efforts for Puget Sound Starts Here have relied mainly on paid digital and social media efforts. The 2024 and 2025 campaigns have been an effort to work more directly with ethnic media as the professional community communications experts. By working directly with media, using a show-and-tell, experiential approach to stormwater, clean water actions and 6PPDq, we are hoping to increase awareness both with media and the communities they serve.

### Awareness & Behavior Change

This annual campaign is to fulfill [Washington State's Department of Ecology's Municipal Stormwater Permit](#) requirements for education and outreach, S5.C 11 which outlines what cities, counties and other permittees are responsible for annually:

“The SWMP (Stormwater Management Program) shall include an education and outreach program designed to:

- Build general awareness about methods to address and reduce impacts from stormwater runoff;
- Effect behavior change to reduce or eliminate behaviors and practices that cause or contribute to adverse stormwater impacts; and
- Create stewardship opportunities that encourages community engagement in addressing the impacts from stormwater runoff.

Permittees may choose to meet these requirements individually or as a member of a regional group. Regional collaboration on general awareness or behavior change programs, or both, includes Permittees developing a consistent message, determining best methods for communicating the message, and when appropriate, creating strategies to effect behavior change.”

The focus of the annual Puget Sound Starts Here clean water awareness campaign is regularly updated using interviews and environmental data on pollutants that stormwater professionals are addressing throughout the region. Messaging has included general clean water tips and actions such as pet waste, car washing, fixing car leaks, and toxic tire particles.

The original Puget Sound Starts Here general water quality campaigns began in 2008 using social marketing research and strategies. With grant funding (to date, over \$5M in state, federal and local grants) these grew

to include the *Some Things Don't Mix*, *Don't Drip & Drive* and *Don't Wait to Inflate* campaigns. When grants are not available, regional city and county partners contribute to an annual campaign. Funding from contributions has varied from \$60K to \$100K a year and managed by an ad hoc campaign team. ## INSIGHTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This is a short summary of the 2025 experience. More discussion and analysis should be used for planning future efforts.

Regional news source: Using the Seattle Times as the regional ad source, rather than social media such as Meta or Instagram offered advantages to the multiple counties, and better local traffic to the website rather than reported impressions on social media. A side benefit is investing in local news rather than social media. Social media algorithms have been recently updated again, making it very difficult to see or share posts without paying in for ad buys or verifying impressions.

### **Seattle Times Advertising – Paid Media**

- Simple advertising with complete messaging is helpful to share information with viewers, even without click-throughs to the website.
- Efficient costs below the average (\$0.70 per click versus \$1-\$2), and above average click thru rate (1.5% versus 1.0 average) and the local engagement showed that Seattle Times ads were an effective tactic to reach regional audiences.
- The ads reached over 600,000 King, Kitsap, Pierce, Snohomish, Thurston and Whatcom County residents.
- Kitsap and Thurston County residents were most engaged with our ads, generating the highest click engagement, possibly as a result of less information reach in earlier campaigns.
- The higher results for King and Snohomish Counties can be attributed to a larger number of partners and advertising investment.

The 2025 Puget Sound Starts Here (PSSH) campaign included Seattle Times ads (banner, side and insert) to reach residents across the Puget Sound region (King County, Kitsap County, Pierce County, Snohomish County, Thurston County, Whatcom County).

#### Results:

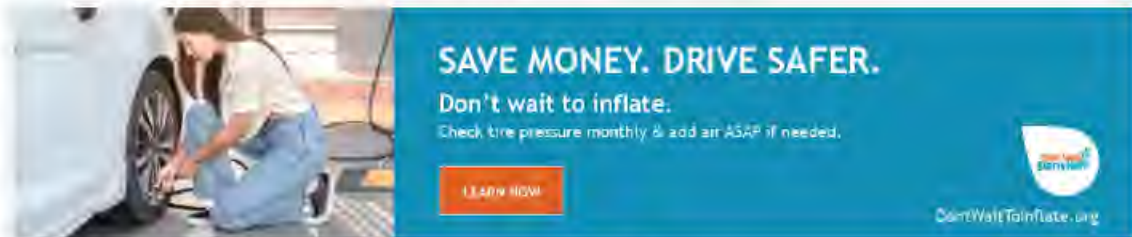
- Ad efforts reached nearly **600,000 residents** throughout the Puget Sound region (county-based strategy)
- Over **3.4M impressions** (each person saw our ads about five times)
- A total of **51,665 clicks** to the Don't Wait to Inflate website.

PSSH made a focused effort to work with local community influencers through ethnic media at

the Piper's Creek Salmon celebration. The in-language coverage was exceptional. Especially helpful were on-site interpreters discussing salmon, tires, and 6PPD in Spanish and Chinese. Online traffic saw increased visits to the in-language website, YouTube and social media.

2026 efforts will work toward the inclusion of Clean Car Care in the updated Washington Drivers' Education curricula. Regional partners can help by promoting the Clean Car Care quiz available in Spanish, Korean, Vietnamese and English.

## Ethnic media engagement at Piper's Creek Salmon Celebration event – Earned/Organic Media

- Experiential show-and-tell about water quality issues, tires, 6PPDq and salmon, reinforced with bilingual Salmon Stewards resulted in high, positive media coverage and engaged and interested reporters.

- Relationships built since 2020 and personal invitations from Bridge Latino brought media to the event.
- These invitations are building positive relationships with community media and respond to community interest in environmental topics and information.
- Under You Tube traffic, 44% of the audience is over 65+ years old and 65% age 55+. This may be driven by the ethnic media buys in January 2025 and worth noting as we plan to reach youth and parents.

### Response to advertising and video creative materials

- Review of You Tube video completion shows the target video time for future How-to video is 90 seconds (versus the 2:51 current time).
- The lower click through response to the Korean and Vietnamese ads that were translated may indicate a need to co-create future advertising and identify cultural interests and values.

### Partner participation

- Regional sharing of media and information can be built up through the coming year with more shared tips and information, but social and other participation generated 73 responses to the shared survey.
- City of Mukilteo created a ‘dad-style’ [short Instagram how-to](#), reflecting the interest in car care coaching in audiences of all ages, and created a social media schedule:



- Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation heard about the project and set up their own summer tire pressure check event, hinting at an interest from youth in both car care and salmon and environmental actions.

## PROJECT SUMMARY

### STRATEGY

Thirty city and county partners contributed to the 2025 Don't Wait to Inflate Campaign. A team of stormwater professionals volunteer with paid community consultants to design, implement and track the campaign. The approach was to recruit and hire a collaborative consulting team of minority and women owned small businesses and nonprofit agencies.

The team chose not to advertise on popular social media channels such as Meta and Instagram with the impersonal and difficult to verify reach and changing algorithms. The focus instead was to continue to invest in local community influencers and economies through ethnic media and their channels, continue to build relationships with ethnic media, and invest in the regional news network of the Seattle Times. Regional partners share the key messages, social media, web and video creative, and when possible, send reporting to the project team.

A Clean Car Care two-sided handout in English/Spanish, Vietnamese or Korean, was created to bundle the vehicle related clean water actions. A short survey that can be shared with staff, crews, residents and others was created for partners to use to track awareness and behaviors.

### Audiences, Key Messages

Audience research [identified vehicle owner demographics in the four language groups](#) (Burshek Research & Consulting, 2022). [Message and audience research prioritized the key messages](#) (GA Creative, 2022) that resonated with audiences (Spanish, Korean, Vietnamese and English language), which are, in order of audience preference:

STAY SAFER ON THE ROAD - Improve vehicle handling and safety and avoid blowouts.

SAVE MONEY - Improve your gas mileage by up to 3% and get more life out of your tires.

HELP SAVE OUR SALMON - Help protect our local coho salmon from tire particles that shed 6PPD-q pollutants.

The last message has had a slight preference from Spanish speaking audiences that lean toward environmental messaging (as suggested in the 2023 campaign social media responses and click throughs).

## Campaign Objectives

As shared with the STORM collaborative as part of the partner ask for contributions, the project objectives were:

1. Run a digital ad campaign working with local and ethnic media in multiple languages.
2. Share creative [videos](#), advertising and social posts via the [social media kit](#) (the [Partners & Pals toolkit](#)).
3. Create a 1-page information sheet to share and DIY Survey to identify awareness and behaviors by zip code.
4. Incorporate Clean Car Care curricula into Washington State Drivers Education.
5. Run the campaign from October – December 2025, reporting raw data in December and completing the report in first quarter 2026 to meet annual reporting requirements.

## Contributor Zip Codes and Media Coverage

The project partners tested a new approach to reaching zip code areas throughout the Puget Sound region by combining specific ethnic media outlets with Seattle Times regional media for counties and cities.

The community media plan below shows the distribution of zip codes and primary media resources. Where coverage by specific ethnic media may be unclear, the zip codes have been grouped into county wide coverage areas used by Seattle Times special editions.

Seattle’s Ethnic Media Program defines ethnic media as:

..."ethnic media" as any communications outlet that intentionally produces journalistic news stories and other informational and/or entertainment content for a particular cultural or linguistic group or ethnic community residing in the U.S.

The list of regional ethnic media resources was maintained by Seattle, but updates of that list were last made in 2023. The Puget Sound Starts Here team has been working with Resource Media and Bridge Latino on updated lists shared with the Public Health – Seattle & King County media team.

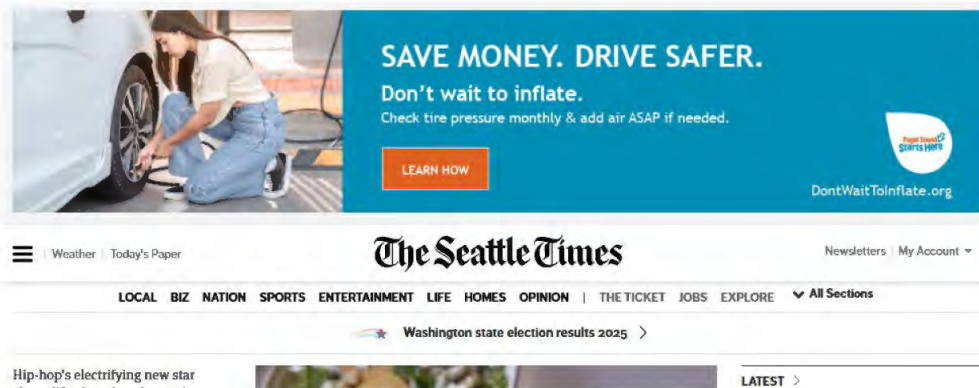

The ad campaign ran in Seattle Times and other Meta (Facebook/Instagram) sites throughout November and December 2025. Total advertising budget was \$36,314, divided by county investment levels. Seattle Times was chosen as both an investment in local news and to reach the project partner’s multiple counties.

## Results

- Overall, ad efforts **reached nearly 600,000 residents** throughout WA state.
- This resulted in **over 3.4M impressions** (meaning each person saw our ads about five times, which is good saturation).
- A total of **51,665 clicks** to the Don’t Wait to Inflate website.
- Strong click engagement with an overall **click-through rate of 1.5%**, which is higher than the average (~1%).
- Efficient costs results with a **cost-per-click of \$0.70**, lower than the averages (~\$1-\$2).
- **Post engagement results:** over 4,200 post reactions, 243 shares, 100 saves, and 90 comments.

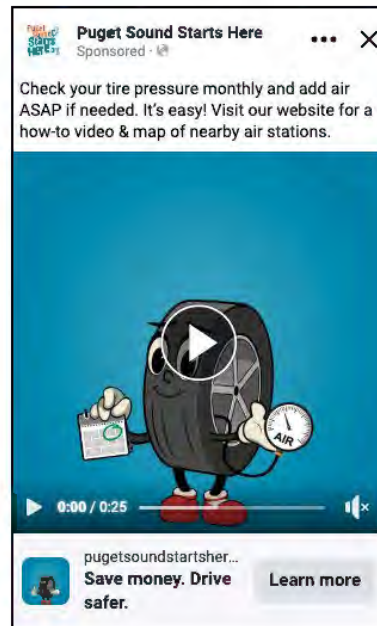

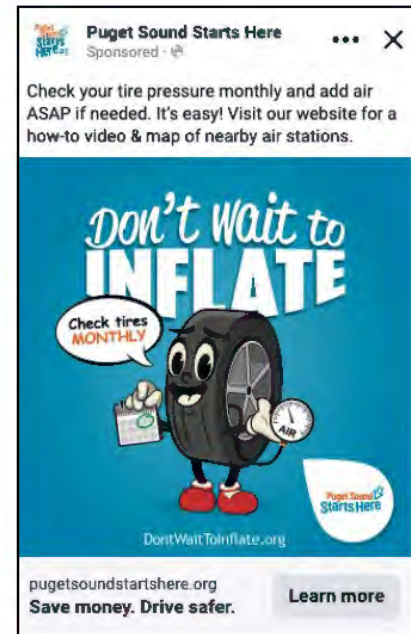

According to the "Puget Sound Starts Here" project, car tires commonly contain the additive 6PPD to extend tire life. However, when 6PPD comes into contact with air and ozone, it transforms into the highly toxic 6PPD-q. When tire wear particles fall onto the road surface, they are concentrated and washed into the storm drain network during the first heavy autumn rains, eventually flowing into streams and the Puget Sound waterway.

Damm stated that the chemical has a direct and fatal effect on salmon: "Their gills cannot properly absorb oxygen from the water, resulting in symptoms such as continuous mouth opening and struggling, which appears as if they are suffocating. Most salmon will die within 15 to 30 minutes."

The study also showed that the first flush after a dry period is when pollution accumulates the most on roads, and the pollution peak is particularly likely to trigger mass salmon deaths.

"There are no large factories discharging pollutants in the city, but every car, every home car wash, and every improperly disposed of chemical product will enter the streams through the rainwater system," Damm emphasized that the 6PPD-q case illustrates that in the modern urban ecosystem, the sources of pollution are highly dispersed but have a huge impact, and it is essential for the public to work together to reduce emissions.

He pointed out that although research teams and the government are promoting the upgrading of rainwater treatment facilities, "individual behavior is the most basic and direct line of defense."

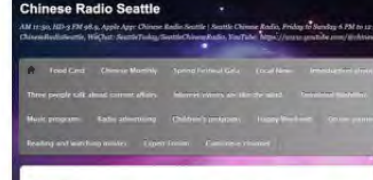
### Volunteers: Small actions in daily life can reduce the amount of pollutants entering the stream.

Environmental volunteers at the scene introduced simple practices that ordinary people and communities can take to reduce the entry of these deadly pollutants into the aquatic environment.

- **Maintain proper tire pressure:** Insufficient tire pressure will accelerate tire wear and cause more 6PPD-q particles to fall off.
- **Regular vehicle maintenance:** Timely handling of oil leaks and brake pad wear can significantly reduce the inflow of pollutants into the rainwater system.
- **Avoid washing your car at home:** Washing your car in residential areas will cause wastewater containing chemicals to flow directly into the storm drain. You should choose a commercial car wash with wastewater treatment facilities.
- **Properly clean up pet excrement and yard chemicals** to prevent them from entering streams with rainwater.
- **Support natural filtration systems** such as rain gardens, allowing surface runoff to be filtered through the soil before entering water bodies.

One volunteer emphasized that salmon are "indicator species" in urban ecosystems: "If adult salmon can still successfully migrate through a city's streams, it means that the entire ecosystem is still healthy; protecting salmon is actually equivalent to protecting our water sources and living environment."

In addition, salmon are crucial to the survival of 137 other species throughout the Pacific Northwest. If the survival of salmon is threatened, the entire ecosystem will also face significant risks.



### Carkeek Park hosts its annual salmon festival; experts warn of harmful pollutants on tires.

[Seattle Chinese Radio Report, Reporter: Terry] Seattle's Carkeek Park hosted its annual Salmon Celebration this weekend, attracting many families and nature enthusiasts to watch the salmon run and participate in on-site environmental education activities. One of the highlights of this year's event was to inform the public about the serious impact of the chemical 6PPD-q from car tires on salmon and urban aquatic health.



### More than ten environmental protection booths set up in the park, making parent-child learning and nature education a highlight.

On that day, representatives from King County's environmental department, the Seattle City Department of Public Utilities, and several environmental partners set up more than ten informational and interactive tents in the park, covering topics such as salmon life cycle demonstrations, rainwater management education, and sustainable horticulture demonstrations. Many families brought their children to participate in activities such as drawing, observation, and Q&A sessions, creating a lively atmosphere.

A Chinese-speaking volunteer at the scene explained to reporters that this year, various organizations have placed particular emphasis on the impact of daily urban activities on water health. "Many people don't realize that car tires, engine oil, or even how families wash their cars are directly related to the survival of salmon," said a volunteer from the community.



The interactive game installations at the event attracted the attention of many teenagers.

### Tire chemical 6PPD-q: Studies confirm a direct link to mass salmon deaths.

Steve Damm, a retired environmental scientist and ecology educator who was interviewed at the scene, pointed out that in recent years the scientific community has confirmed that a chemical called 6PPD-q is a major cause of "pre-spawn mortality" in Coho salmon (silver salmon) in the Pacific Northwest.

### Education and monitoring are ongoing, and public participation in volunteer programs is encouraged.

Carkeek Park regularly conducts water quality monitoring, salmon surveys, and community nature education programs. Volunteers explain that they patrol the creek every Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday, explaining salmon behavior and ecological threats to the public. The autumn survey also records salmon numbers and their survival status, and performs autopsies on dead individuals to determine if pollution is a factor.

Xiaoyu, a volunteer at the scene, told reporters that witnessing salmon struggling against the current strengthened her resolve to participate in environmental protection. "Once, I saw a group of fish trapped in shallow water. After observing the terrain, the volunteers slightly adjusted the baffle to allow the water to flow again, and the fish immediately swam upstream one by one. That moment made me realize that protecting the ecosystem does not entirely depend on large-scale projects; sometimes it is just a matter of crucial, small acts of help."



The salmon run at Carkeek Park is expected to last until late November. The park is advising residents to remain quiet while watching the salmon, not to frighten them, not to enter the stream, and not to allow pets near the fish, in order to minimize disturbance to wildlife.

The organizers stated that they hope the annual salmon festival will help more residents understand the fragility of urban ecosystems, recognize the ecological value of salmon, and learn about concrete actions that everyone can take.



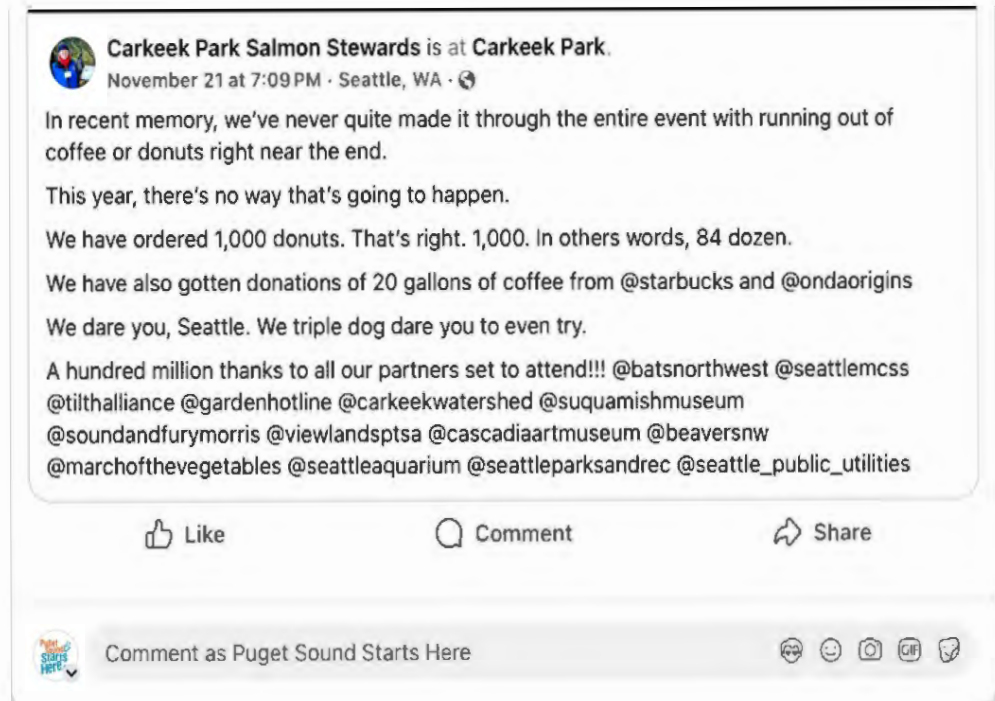

## CLEAN CAR CARE

Quick guide to help keep water clean

When it rains, pollution from cars wash into storm drains, and then straight into local streams, lakes, rivers, and Puget Sound.

Pollutants like oil, car wash soaps and chemicals, and bits of tire that get off the road are bad for water quality. Pollution hurts people and wildlife, salmon and oysters. We all depend on clean water to survive.

Maintaining your vehicle helps protect our environment.

### TIRE MAINTENANCE

Proper tire maintenance will extend the life of your tires and save you money.

- Keep tires properly inflated so that they will wear down more slowly. Check your tire pressure once per month, either with your own pressure gauge or at a gas station air pump. You can find the recommended tire pressure in your owner's manual, or on a sticker inside the driver's side door.
- Get your tire alignment checked and rotate tires according to the manufacturer's instructions. Proper alignment and regular rotation prevent uneven wear on your tires, reducing the amount of tire particles that wear off as you drive.

Car tires have many chemicals that help protect them from damage. As we drive, the tires wear down, leaving tiny bits of tire left on our roads. The chemicals in the tire bits are toxic to fish. When it rains, the runoff picks up the tire bits and carries them down storm drains and into our waterways.

Scientists recently discovered an ingredient in tires called IPPD-Q. It's used to preserve the rubber, but when it reacts with ozone in the air, it transforms into a new chemical that's highly toxic to water salmon.

Taking care of your tires is the best thing drivers can do to reduce wear and prevent tire pollution. To learn more, visit [Don'tWaitToInflate.org](http://Don'tWaitToInflate.org).

### CAR WASHING

- Take your car to a commercial car wash. Commercial car washes, both automatic and hand, are required to treat their dirty wash water.
- If using a commercial car wash isn't an option, wash your car in a drainy area. The grass and dirt will soak up the wash water, preventing it from running down the street into a storm drain.

When you wash your car, the rinse water contains harmful pollutants like oil, grease, heavy metals and soaps. If you wash your car on the street or in your driveway, the pollutants run on the street and into the storm drain, and then flow untreated into local creeks, lakes, rivers and Puget Sound. That's why in many communities it's illegal to let that soapy water enter a storm drain.

### DON'T DRIP AND DRIVE

Take these steps to maintain the health of your vehicle and the environment:

- Check your vehicle for leaks regularly and get them fixed promptly.
- Always dispose of used motor oil properly by bringing it to your local auto shop for recycling. Call or visit 1-800-RECYCLE to find a location near you.
- Use grassed curbs or drip pans. If you find a leak or are doing engine work, clean up spills immediately.

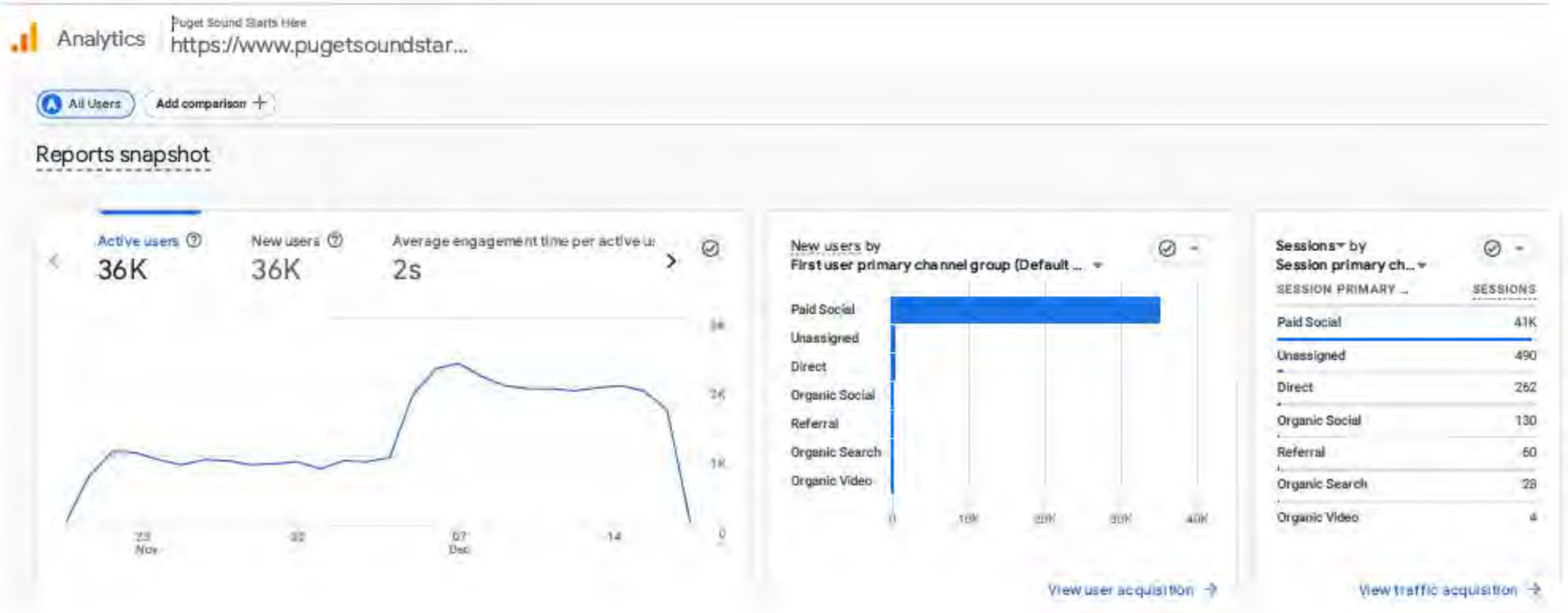

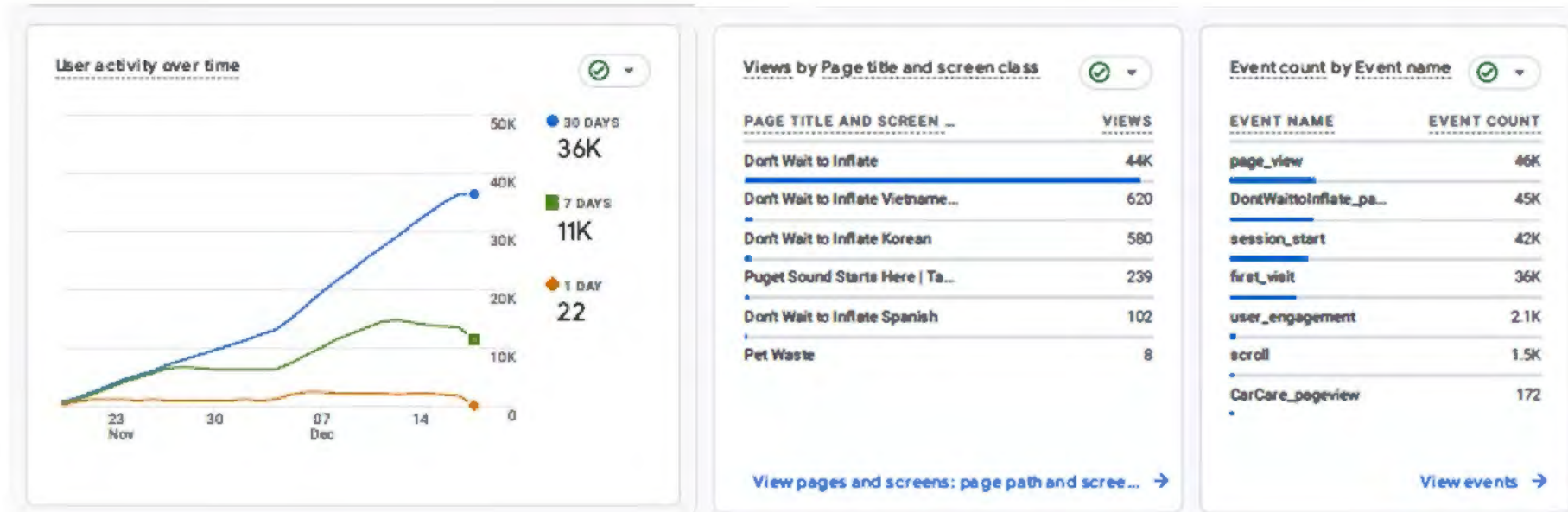

## LOOKING FORWARD TO 2026

Partners and pals can continue using social media kits and advertising both to share information and use it to continue awareness and behavior change evaluation. The survey has been translated into the key languages and will be added to the Clean Car Care and Don't Wait to Inflate web pages.

Keeping the campaign moving forward in 2026, there are several considerations. The first is to reenergize the Puget Sound Starts Here [Collective Impact strategy and team](#), using this opportunity to build collaborative practices for better governance, to practice leadership and efficient local government approaches, and to

create regional projects beyond the capacity of individual jurisdictions. These skills have the potential to shift public involvement practices toward improved community participation as well. The connections and relationships built with ethnic media, local women and minority owned companies, and nonprofits can be an asset to other public engagement efforts. Learning through these projects also offers opportunity and insights for outreach and engagement with underserved audiences.

### **Tentative plans for 2026:**

- Review and discuss this report data more thoroughly for insights.
- Continue to share creative [videos](#), advertising and social posts via the [social media kit](#) (the [Partners & Pals toolkit](#)) through city, county, state and nonprofit networks.
- Share the *Clean Water Questions for Puget Sound Survey* (<https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/MBPVC2V>) on blogs, social media, newsletters, etc. to gather insights into awareness, behaviors and partner zip codes.
- Upload the multilanguage surveys; share links.
- Continue to work with local and ethnic media (and update media lists) to connect on environmental projects.
- Consider user testing and co-creation of the Clean Car Care materials and web pages with language access partners (and use this opportunity to practice co-creation) through ethnic media, Affinity groups, Community Navigators, nonprofit organizations and other community assets.
- Consider more research on beginning and new driver's barriers and benefits.
- Work with WA DOL Curricula development on Clean Car Care content for new driver's manual, training and education to improve road safety, build basic car care and pollutant awareness, and engage drivers in stewardship.
- Consider reaching out to driving schools on barriers and benefits on new curricula, including Train the Trainer, video or other information options.

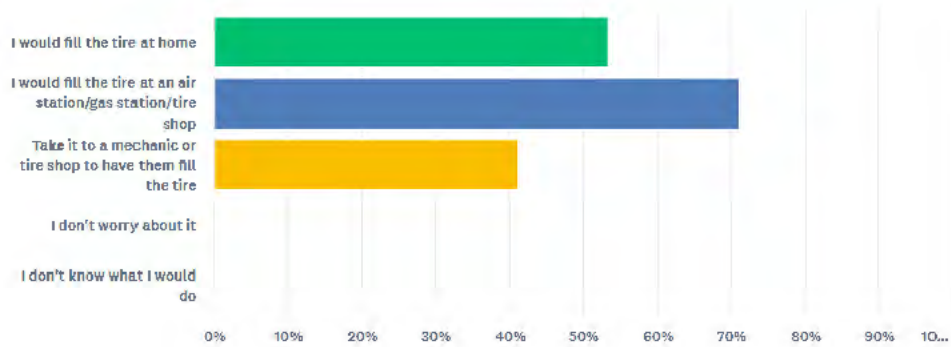

**Teen Car Care Intercept Survey Summary Report**  
**Pollution Prevention Behavior Change Program**  
**City of Bellevue Utilities, Water Quality, Stream Team**

The survey and report were written by Laurie Devereaux, *Stream Team Program Administrator*, and Conor Frizelle, *Stream Team High School Intern*. All survey data was collected and compiled by Conor Frizelle.

### **Summary**

In preparation for a Pollution Prevention Car Care Behavior Change Program for local teens, information was collected through intercept surveys in January 2025. The focus of the survey questions was on the behaviors of checking tire pressure and checking for vehicle leaks. The data will be used to create a behavior change program.

After formatting the data and drafting this report, we consulted Tuan Nguyen, a professor of mechanics at Lake Washington Institute of Technology and former car shop owner for his thoughts on a couple of key questions that this survey revealed. Appendix B shows the questions that we asked him. Throughout this report, quotes from him will also be mentioned and referred to.

### **Tire Pressure**

About half of the students had checked tire pressure before but not frequently. All students that knew how to check their tires were shown by their dad. There is a reliance on the vehicles' warning light to tell students when to check tire pressure and a reliance on other family members too. Lack of awareness, laziness, and procrastination were reasons not to check tire pressure.

Safety was a top motivator to check tire pressure but students also mentioned fuel efficiency and the environment. When consulting Nguyen for some information about this, he cited the fact that safety is a valid concern. A car with properly inflated tires is significantly safer than a car on tires without adequate inflation. A tire pressure gauge is a possible motivator along with information on why it is important and easy-to-follow instructions and video.

### **Vehicle Leaks**

Only one student had checked a vehicle for leaks as they were taught to do a "walk around" by their driving school. Reasons for not checking for leaks included a general lack of awareness, self admitted laziness, and reliance on their vehicle to tell them if there was an issue. One student said "if they drive and EV" may be alluding to some background knowledge on the fact that electric vehicles (EVs) do not leak. Nguyen agreed, stating "fully electric vehicles do not leak." However, hybrid vehicles can.

Motivators to check for leaks included fiscal, environmental, and longevity reasons. Students are worried about having to spend too much on their car, so we might be able to use messaging motivating them to do an action now to save themselves down the road. Nguyen thought that people "will [definitely] save money on gas." Additionally, students are conscious of their environmental footprint, and don't want to cause any damage to our ecosystems. Finally, students want their car to not have any issues, and so by checking for leaks, we can say that they are keeping their car in good health.

### **Survey Overview, Questions, and Individual Responses**

**The survey consisted of 29 questions asked of high school-aged teens at Interlake and Bellevue High School.** The full list of questions can be found in the appendix of this document.

**In total, 15 responses were recorded:** 13 online via Microsoft Forms, and 2 responses in person, on paper, which were then entered into the spreadsheet by hand. The students that responded online were prompted to through either a QR code that was shown to them, or a link sent to their Microsoft teams account.

**The survey is divided into three main sections:**

1. Demographic Questions
2. Questions about Tire Pressure
3. Questions about Car Leaks

**Influences** on Learning about Tire Pressure and Leaks

- Students generally turn to their family (mentioned 9 times) for information on vehicle maintenance, particularly tire pressure and leaks.
- **Family** was ranked the most influential, with an average ranking of 1.79.
- Other influences were ranked as follows: Driver’s Ed (2.5), Peers (3.07), Teachers (3.21), and School Administrators (4.5).

Quote:

*“I don’t know much about cars [because] my parents don’t know much about cars, they usually just take [their car] into to a car shop whenever they run into a problem.”*

**Promotional incentives** - Students were interested in receiving stickers or other “swag” the most. Responses include:

- Stickers (2)
- Swag (4)
- Handouts (3)
- Lanyard (2)

- Social Media/Videos/PSA (2)
- “people showing up to teach”, money, tires, a car, a pin (1 each)

Quote:

“Social media posts like Instagram short-form content or YouTube videos, handouts, word-of-mouth, news, newsletters (not necessarily only about cars and related info, for example National Geographic is one I subscribe to and they have a variety of topics and this is one way I get exposed to new knowledge I never really thought about before)”

## Gender Differences

Male students

- ranked family higher as a source of influence,
- are more likely to check their vehicle’s tire pressure, and
- view checking tire pressure and car leaks as more of a chore.

Quote:

“[Checking my car tire pressure] would take too much effort.”  
 “[I’m] too lazy to check and my car drives fine.”

Female students are

- less likely to check tire pressure themselves,
- delegate car care tasks to their family,
- worry more about the risks of under-inflated tires and leaking cars, and
- are generally more open to learning how to perform these tasks.

Quote:

“It could be dangerous if the tire pressure is low since the tire could suddenly pop while driving, and it's also probably harder to drive and maneuver with low tire pressure which would make it more risky and accident-prone.”

## Tire Pressure –

*There is a need for instructional content on how to check tire pressure. There is a reliance on car warning indicator lights.*

### Experience with Checking Tire Pressure –

- 8 students had checked tire pressure
- 7 had not checked tire pressure

### Reason for Not Checking Tire Pressure

- Most students do not check tire pressure because the **warning light** has not turned on.
- The **warning light** is commonly relied upon as the main indicator for when something is wrong with the car.

**Instruction** - All students who learned how to check tire pressure were taught by their father, suggesting that students without a consistent male figure, or one interested in automotive care, may be less likely to know how to perform this task.

**Frequency** of Checking - Students generally don’t check tire pressure often because they trust the **warning light to notify** them when necessary.

## Reasons for Checking Tire Pressure

- The main concern for students about tire pressure is that it could be **dangerous** if the tires are over or under-inflated.
- Some uncertainty was observed when students were asked this question in person, indicating that many had not thought deeply about the importance of tire pressure. This could be an opportunity to encourage more frequent checks.

Quote:

*“Because its dangerous if we don’t (?)”*

*Students paused and a couple gave a grimace, showing they didn’t know the answer to this question.*

## Factors that Could Encourage More Frequent Checks

- Students would be more likely to check tire pressure regularly if they had a tire pressure gauge. (Gauges were mentioned 5 separate times)
- Presenting data on the dangers of driving with flat tires would also increase their likelihood of checking tire pressure.
- Currently, students rely on checking the **indicator light** instead of manually checking tire pressure.

Quote:

*“There is a warning that tells me when I need to [check my tires.]”*

---

## Car Leak Questions

Experience with Checking for Leaks - **No students** had checked their car for leaks using a paper sheet underneath the car. One student reported doing a walk-around of the car each time they parked.

## Reasons for Not Checking for Leaks

Students generally do not check for leaks because they either **don’t know how** or have to do so.

Quote:

*“I haven't seen a pool of water or anything under the car, so I don't think there is a leak.”*

**The one student who did a walk-around** was taught this method through their Driver’s Ed at 911 Driving School.

## Future Intentions

Students are unlikely to check their cars for leaks in the future due to a **lack of knowledge** and understanding of **why it’s important**.

## Reasons for Checking for Leaks

Students care about checking for leaks primarily for **safety and cost** reasons. They are concerned about the danger of driving an unsafe vehicle and the potential for more expensive repairs if a leak is left unchecked.

*Quote:*

*"[I would want to check for leaks] to not have a problem build up that costs a lot to repair."*

#### **Factors that Could Encourage Leak Checks**

- If students were **informed that car leaks are common**, they expressed an increased likelihood of checking for leaks.
- Students would also be more likely to check for leaks if they **received clear instructions on how to do so**.
- **Short, instructional videos** were mentioned as something that would make students feel more confident and "comfortable" checking for leaks.

#### **Current Methods for Checking Leaks**

Instead of using a paper sheet, students typically do a **walk-around** of their car or simply **do not check** for leaks at all.
