Why are you interested in serving as a Tukwila City Councilmember?

As a lifetime resident of the City of Tukwila I am fully vested in the health, prosperity, and continued growth of our community while still celebrating our history. During my lifetime, I've witnessed and been part of incredible waves of change in Tukwila. The changes have come in many forms ranging from expansion of our business districts to improvements with our infrastructures to the revitalization of Tukwila International Boulevard to redevelopment of our schools to a significantly increased diversity in our residential as well as visiting populations. These incredible changes have brought about incredible challenges as well as opportunities for our City. I recognize that in any organization it is critical that both are managed equally well.

In my 20 years working at the City of Bellevue change management has been a crucial part of my responsibilities. It is natural that people fear change; still, change is essential for successful growth. With the fluctuating dynamics of and diversity in the population in Tukwila it is now more important than ever to fully engage our community members in the City's actions and efforts in order to successfully meet or exceed the city goals. For this to work it is imperative that our community members from all ages, races, ethnicities, genders, affiliations, and economics statuses feel comfortable, included, and represented. City Council is the face of Tukwila and intended to be a well-rounded representation of our community.

As a City Councilmember I will have the opportunity to provide that representation and demonstrate fair and equitable leadership, to actively empower and encourage increased community involvement, to help maintain fiscal responsibility and accountability of city resources, to promote innovative, forward-thinking, sustainable growth while still including historical perspective, and finally to help further the reputation of our city as the place you want to be - your place to live, play, work, and grow.

Describe your background in community service, including any volunteer work you have done in or around Tukwila.

In addition to working full-time, I am a mother of five children, all of whom attended the Tukwila School District and graduated from Foster High School; with my youngest just recently graduating in June, 2023. While all were in school, I volunteered my time assisting in all their classrooms each year K-12, chaperoned nearly every field trip, and assisted with special events as needed. I was an assistant coach for their youth soccer teams. I also assisted in organizing food-drives as well as prepared team meals for the high school sports teams and volunteered my time during tournaments.

Throughout my lifetime I have been involved in a variety of additional community service opportunities from volunteering at food pantries and emergency shelters to neighborhood clean-up and special events in Tukwila, Seattle, and Bellevue. I have also spent the past five years as a volunteer care provider.

What do you think are the most important issues facing Tukwila in the next 2-4 years?

Tukwila is a uniquely positioned city in the Pacific Northwest. Situated between an International Airport and Seaport we benefit from both visitors and business opportunities. Our city is also complimented by the inclusion of the Department of Immigration and Naturalization Services, adding the to diversity in our community members. In combination with that, and still on the recovering end of the COVID-19 pandemic we have many important issues to address as follows:

Describe your understanding of the importance of regional collaboration and partnership in city government.

Regional collaboration and partnership in city government is crucial, especially as a government agency. As a government agency we are tasked with providing services for our residents and community members, whether occupants, homeowners, visitors, employees, business owners, or investors. Our efforts at providing the best possible services and solutions are often done so with limited resources at any individual city level. Stil, it is our charge to provide services in the most beneficial, economical and efficient manner as is possible. Similar types of community services are needed and often cross boundaries between cities or regions. Services such as social, health, housing, transportation, and financial assistance. Regional collaboration provides the opportunity to expand the level of services and potential funding available for the same. Partnerships provide expanded service options that might not otherwise exist solely within our own city limits and that can be extended to those in need without creating competitive services between cities or agencies. It helps to reduce redundancies, increase efficiencies, improve fiscal responsibility, and contributes to overall measurable performance metrics across the varying organizations. I am a long-time public employee working for a city that embraces, encourages, and educates its staff on inclusion and diversity. I am a recent member of the City's EMBRACE Allies team which helps promote the City's Diversity Advantage Initiative which is rooted in the principles of equity, access, inclusion, opportunity and cultural competence.

I am a 3rd generation, lifetime resident of and property owner in the City of Tukwila. I have been witness to and part of significant changes in our community over the past 50+ years. I have been a Business Process and Systems Analyst for the past 20 years working for the City of Bellevue. Change Management and Continual Process Improvement are core responsibilities of my daily work. I specialize in Project Evaluation and Management and Issue Resolution which requires departmental, interdepartmental, and external onoging and transparent communications, negotiations, and innovation. Several of the more recent complex projects I've helped lead have had a very fast-paced, escalated and critical timeline requiring the ability to learn, evaluate, and make expedient decisions in order to move forward.
