

PROGRAMS, SERVICES AND FACILITIES

Program areas include golf, art and culture, fitness, wellness, sport, dance, martial art and enrichment programs, activities, and special events. TPRD provides adaptive and specialized recreation opportunities for individuals with disabilities and administers a youth and family scholarship program. The Tukwila Community Center serves as the primary activity hub, facility rental venue and departmental headquarters. Additionally, Foster Golf Links offers an 18-hole, par 68 course, together with a clubhouse, golf shop, restaurant, banquet and meeting rooms, and event center.

THE MISSION of the Tukwila Parks and Recreation Department is to enhance the quality of life for residents, businesses and visitors through a comprehensive system of public spaces, programs and events that enhance and support a wide range of recreational opportunities, including spaces for leisure, play, fitness, relaxation, community gatherings, civic engagement, and much more.



TUKWILA COMMUNITY CENTER

Situated along the Duwamish River, the Tukwila Community Center offers over 48,000 square feet of multi-use event space and serves as the destination for meetings, banquets and events. An 11,000 square foot gymnasium, large banquet room and social hall, and numerous classrooms are available for rent. Free and affordable opportunities are provided including causal drop-in activities and events, and registration-based programs.



PARK RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Tukwila Municipal Code Title 12 Parks and Recreation provides for the rules and regulations and conduct governing parks. Parks are open daily dawn (30 minutes prior to sunrise) to dusk (30 minutes after sunset).

DEPARTMENT LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

TPRD is led by a Mayor appointed and Council confirmed Parks and Recreation Director who is responsible for the administration and professional management of the Department.

Staff maintain a variety of certifications and endorsements, including Certified Playground Safety Inspector, First Aid, AED and CPR, commercial driver license (CDL), certified pesticide applicator, PGA certifications, National Incident Management System certifications (NIMS) and Certified Park and Recreation Professional (CPRP) credentials.



The Tukwila Library Advisory Board, Parks Commission and

Arts Commission provide guidance, assistance and recommendations to Parks and Recreation staff, the Mayor's Office and City Council on a variety of relevant issues, programs and initiatives. The City's biennial budget, capital improvement plan, Strategic Plan, Comprehensive Plan, Parks and Recreation Open Space Plan (PROS) and a variety of department sub-plans provide a framework and set of priorities to guide operations and investments.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Volunteers help make Tukwila more vibrant whether serving on an advisory board, helping with Meals-on-Wheels, instructing, coaching or officiating activities, assisting with special events, performing park and trail clean-ups, conducting litter patrols, or replanting trees and vegetation. Volunteers are always welcome.
